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1. Overview of Business Results, etc.

(1) Overview of Business Results for the Six Months Under Review

In the six months under review, Japanese economy continued it has gradual recovery supported by inbound demand and the progress in the normalization of socioeconomic activities. On the other hand, the outlook remains uncertain, partly due to downside risks to capital investment and personal consumption owing to the rapid rise in prices, the prolonged depreciation of the yen, international tensions in Ukraine and the Middle East, and concerns about the increase in import tariffs in The United States of America.

In the domestic construction industry, both public construction investment and private capital investment remain solid and steady, however, overall construction costs are rising due to high prices of construction materials and energy, as well as soaring labor costs driven by labor shortages. Under these challenging business surroundings, it has become more difficult to generate operating revenue compared with the past.

As a result, business performance of the Group company for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was as follows: orders received (including the Development business and others) decreased by ¥2,641 million (13.4%) from the previous corresponding period to ¥17,125 million; net sales increased by ¥4,313 million (29.1%) to ¥19,159 million; operating profit increased by ¥457 million (28.9%) to ¥2,037 million; ordinary profit increased by ¥705 million (43.8%) to ¥2,317 million; and profit attributable to owners of parent increased by ¥511 million (48.3%) to ¥1,571 million.

The following sections describe business results for each segment of the business units.

(Construction business)

The Company focused on order receiving activities that leverage our strengths by enhancing information sharing and collaboration in sales, design, estimation, and construction division within the business divisions, as well as strengthening our sales capabilities and proposal capabilities through collaboration with the engineering division.

In addition, we have initiated attracting companies to Kitahotaka Industrial Park developed through a public-private partnership agreement, we have been working to receive orders for large scales projects by actively promoting the development of new client by utilizing business land information. As a result, orders received decreased by ¥1,255 million (7.8%) from the previous corresponding period to ¥14,874 million, net sales of completed construction contracts increased by ¥4,670 million (37.2%) to ¥17,203 million, and operating profit increased by ¥646 million (35.2%) to ¥2,483 million.

(Engineering business)

The Engineering business have conducted research and development activities in accordance with the midterm management plan leveraging our strengths in integrated system from proposal to manufacturing, construction, and maintenance for synthetic floor slabs and large-scale precision, as well as hydroelectric power equipment-related works, which we have had its technology and experience since the company's founding. Specifically, we have developed "Micro Data Center" for BCP measures and monitoring system for production plants "Smart Mill" on our own, we have started sales to the public. In addition, we have engaged in customeroriented sales activities on a medium-to long-term basis such as the Company's own small hydropower plant tours. As a result, orders received decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{1}\),300 million (46.6%) from the previous corresponding period to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{1}\),490 million, net sales of completed construction contracts decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\)1 million (18.5%) to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{1}\),195 million, and operating profit decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\) million (6.2%) to \(\frac{\pmathbf{6}}{6}\)6million.

(Development business and others)

Under such circumstances, the real estate transaction prices in Tokyo metropolitan area continue to soar, considering the ongoing rise in land acquisition cost and construction expenses for new developments, number of new properties for purchase and sale has decreased, we have made efforts to reassess the sales of completed

properties and our strategy. As a result, net sales in the Development business and others decreased by ¥84 million (9.8%) from the previous corresponding period to ¥774million, and operating profit decreased by ¥54 million to ¥7 million.

(2) Overview of Financial Position for the Six Months Under Review

Total assets as of the end of the six months under review amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3},343\) million, increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2},507\) million from the end of previous fiscal year. This is mainly due to a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3},528\)million in cash deposits, but an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{5}}{5},599\) million in notes receivable, accounts receivable from completed construction contracts and other, and contract assets. Liabilities amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{8}}{8},609\) million, increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1},042\) million from the end of previous fiscal year. This is mainly due to a increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{9}}{9}71\)million in accounts payable for construction contracts and increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}89\) million in income taxes payable. Net assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}4,733\) million. As a result, the equity ratio as of the end of the interim consolidated fiscal year was 74.2%.

(3) Explanation of Future Forecast Information such as Forecast of Consolidated Financial Results

There have been no changes to the consolidated financial forecast from the financial forecast announced on May 14, 2025. The financial forecasts are based on information currently available to the Company and certain assumptions deemed reasonable, but there are uncertain elements. Additionally, for the fiscal year ending March 2026, there concerns about increased costs due to rising prices of construction materials, equipment and energy, but the consolidated financial forecast already includes an estimate of the impact. Furthermore, based on future business trends, the Company will properly disclose the details if it becomes necessary to revise this forecast.

(Introduction of stock-based compensation plan)

From the interim consolidated accounting period, the Company has introduced stock-based compensation plan in accordance with the resolution at the 66th annual general meeting for shareholders held June 26, 2025. This plan is intended to clarify the linkage between director 's compensation (excluding directors who are Audit and Supervisory Committee members) and stock value and share the return and the risk associated with stock price volatility with our shareholders to foster an awareness of contribution to improve medium to long-term business performance and enhance the Company's corporate value. The accounting treatment of this Plan is in accordance with the "Practical Treatment of Transactions Concerning the Delivery of Company's Shares to Employees, etc. through Trust" (Practical Response Report No.30, March26,2015)

1) Overview of the system

The Company adopted a mechanism called "Director Compensation BIP (Board Incentive Plan) Trust". Under this Trust, based on the "Regulations on Share Allocation concerning the Compensation BIP Trust for Directors", the trust acquires the number of shares that are expected to be allocated to the relevant directors through third-party allotment from the Company. Subsequently, during the fiscal year corresponding to the medium-term management plan announced by the Company, directors receive the Company's shares and the cash payment equivalent to the share 'value or the proceeds from their disposal, depending on director's position.

2) The Company's shares remain in the Trust

The Company's shares remaining, the "Director Compensation BIP Trust" are recorded as treasury shares in the net asset section based on their book value within that trust. The book value and number of shares of

these treasury shares at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period are ¥67million and 48,800shares.
