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1. Overview of Operating Results

(1)Overview of Operating Results

The Japanese economy in the current fiscal year continued to recover moderately due to improvements in the labor and income environment. On the other hand, it is necessary to continue to closely monitor the impact on policy trends of tariffs in the United States and the responses of other countries, unstable exchange rates, changes in monetary policy, and inflation risks.

In the construction industry, although public investment has been solid and private capital investment has continued to show signs of recovery, the business environment remains difficult due to soaring construction materials prices, rising labor cost, and labor shortages.

Against this backdrop, the Company has been conducting sales activities with the aim of achieving the targets set forth in the new Medium to Long-term Business Plan, "Road to 100th anniversary Embracing New Challenges" (fiscal 2024 to 2030). As a result, the current fiscal year's operating results in order balance recorded 114,727 million yen (up 21.6% from the previous fiscal year), net sales recorded 89,027 million yen (up 14.4% from the previous fiscal year) and carried-over construction balance reached 130,281 million yen (up 25.6% from the previous fiscal year). In terms of earnings, operating profit recorded 3,695 million yen (up 132.4% from the previous fiscal year), ordinary profit recorded 3,710 million yen (up 131.6% from the previous fiscal year) and profit attributable to owners of parent recorded 2,060 million yen (up 66.8% from the previous fiscal year).

(2)Overview of Financial Position

<Assets>

Total Assets at the end of the current fiscal year decreased by 3,512 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 55,595 million yen. Current assets decreased by 390 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 48,264 million yen, and non-current assets decreased by 3,121 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 7,330 million yen.

The decrease in current assets was mainly due to a decrease in cash and deposits by $4{,}317$ million yen. < Liabilities >

Total liabilities at the end of the current fiscal year decreased by 3,954 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 32,601 million yen. Current liabilities decreased by 2,795 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 28,053 million yen, and non-current liabilities decreased by 1,158 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 4,548 million yen.

The decrease in current liabilities was mainly due to a decrease in electronically recorded obligations operating by 9,317 million yen.

< Net assets >

Total net assets at the end of the current fiscal year increased by 442 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 22,993 million yen.

This increase was mainly attributable to an increase of 1,235 million yen in retained earnings mainly due to the recording of profit attributable to owners of parent.

(3) Overview of Cash Flows

Cash flows from operating activities resulted in a decrease in funds of 3,059 million yen (a decrease in funds of 1,919 million yen in the previous fiscal year) mainly due to a decrease in trade payables.

Cash flows from investing activities resulted in an increase in funds of 808 million yen (a decrease in funds of 2,992 million yen in the previous fiscal year) mainly due to proceeds from sale of investment securities.

Cash flows from financing activities resulted in a decrease in funds of 2,066 million yen (an increase in funds of 3,701 million yen in the previous fiscal year) mainly due to repayment of short-term borrowings.

As a result, cash and cash equivalent in the current fiscal year decreased by 4,317 million yen from the previous fiscal year to 4,458 million yen.

(4) Future Outlook

The outlook remains uncertain due to concerns about a slowdown in the domestic and overseas economies triggered by changes in U.S. policy, and the impact of geopolitical risks on the social economy.

In the construction industry, the environment is expected to remain severe, with high energy and raw materials prices and further increases in personnel expenses.

Against this backdrop, the Company has formulated a new medium- to long-term management plan, "Road to 100th anniversary Embracing New Challenges" (FY 2024 to FY 2030), and is aiming to improve profitability and corporate value by taking on the three challenges of "Increasing the tenacity of the construction business", "Enhancing the highly profitable portfolio", and "Bringing the foundations of the business into the next generation" toward its 100 year anniversary in 2037.

For the next fiscal year, the Company forecasts net sales to report 96,400 million yen (up 8.3% from the current fiscal year) and profit attributable to owners of parent to report 2,250 million yen (up 9.2% from the current fiscal year).

The Company believes that the return of profits to shareholders should be determined by comprehensively taking into account the results of the current fiscal year, future prospects, etc., with a view to sustainable and stable shareholder returns with a view to expanding the base of shareholders. The Company believes that it will actively invest in growth and provide stable shareholder returns to further enhance its corporate value, and accordingly, the Company has formulated its policy on shareholder returns as a total payout ratio of at least 50% and a DOE of at least 4.0%. The Company will revise the policy in the event of unexpected changes in the future business environment, business performance, etc.

Based on the above basic policy, the Company forecasts the dividends of 108 yen per share for the next fiscal year (interim dividend of 54 yen, year-end dividend of 54 yen). Going forward, the Company will continue to take measures to strengthen the management base and achieve sustainable growth for stable dividends.

2. Basic Views on the Selection of Accounting Standards

The Company currently has operations limited to Japan and does not have any activities overseas. Therefore, the Company adopts Japanese GAAP for the time being. However, the Company intend to consider the adoption of IFRS in light of future trends in the adoption of IFRS by other domestic companies.

Reasons for exclusion from the scope of consolidation

The above non-consolidated subsidiary was excluded from the scope of consolidation because it is small in size and its assets, net sales, profit and retained earnings, has an insignificant effect on the consolidated financial statements.

(2) Important Depreciation Assets Depreciation Method

i) Property, plant and equipment (excluding leased assets)

The declining-balance method is adopted.

However, with respect to buildings (excluding facilities attached to buildings) acquired on or after April 1, 1998 and facilities attached to buildings and structures acquired on or after April 1, 2016, the straight-line method is applied.

The principal service life are as follows:

Buildings and structures 3 to 50 years Machinery, vehicles, tools, furniture and fixtures 2 to 20 years

ii) Intangible assets (excluding leased assets)

The straight-line method is adopted.

The internal use period (five years) is applied to software for internal use.

Technology assets is amortized based on the economic service life of ten years.

Lease term is applied as service life and the straight-line method is adopted with a residual value of

(3) Significant Provisions Accounting Standards

i) Allowance for doubtful accounts

In order to prepare for losses of defaults, the Company recorded the estimated amount of uncollectible receivables for general receivables based on the bad debt ratio and for doubtful accounts receivables and other doubtful receivables based on individual collectibility.

ii) Provision for warranties for completed construction

In order to prepare for the cost of non-performance of contracts and after-sales service for completed work, the Company recorded the estimated amount of repair costs based on the actual ratio of non-performance of contracts, and for specific completed work, based on individual estimated repair costs.

iii) Provision for bonuses

The Company recorded the amount to be borne by the current fiscal year out of the total estimated amount for the future payment of bonuses for employees.

iv) Provision for loss on construction contracts

To prepare for future losses related to construction orders, the Company recorded the estimated amount of losses related to undelivered construction at the end of the current fiscal year.

v) Provision for share awards

To prepare for the delivery of the Company shares to Directors and Executive Officers, the Company recorded the estimated amount of stock benefit obligations at the end of the current fiscal year.

(4) The Amortization Method and Period of Goodwill;

The goodwill was amortized on a straight-line basis over a period of 10 years.

(5) Accounting for Retirement Benefits

i) Attribution method of estimated retirement benefits

In calculating the benefit obligation, the method of attributing the estimated retirement benefits to the period up to the end of the current fiscal year was based on the benefit formula criteria.

ii) Method of expense treatment for actuarial gains and losses

Actuarial gains and losses were amortized by the straight-line method basis over 10 years, which is shorter than the average remaining years of service, from the fiscal year following the year in which they occur.

(6) Accounting Standards for Significant Revenues and Expenses

The primary business of the Company and its consolidated subsidiaries with respect to revenue from

contracts with customers is the construction business. For performance obligations that are satisfied over a certain period of time, the Company estimates the degree of progress in satisfying the performance obligations and recognizes revenue over a certain period of time based on the degree of progress. When performance obligations are not satisfied over a certain period of time, revenue is recognized as a one-time performance obligation when the performance obligations are satisfied by transferring control over assets to the customer.

The level of progress in satisfying performance obligations is calculated as the ratio of incurred costs to the total construction costs (input method). Net sales of completed construction contracts recognized revenue over a certain period of time based on the level of progress was 86,878 million yen.

(7) Scope of Funds of Consolidated Statement of Cash Flow

The funds consist of cash on hand, deposits that can be withdrawn at any time, and short-term investments that can be easily converted into cash and have a maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition that carries an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(8) Significant Matters for Preparation of Other Consolidated Financial Statements Application of the Aggregate Group Balance Sheet The Aggregate Group Balance Sheet is applied.

(Notes on Changes in Accounting Policies)

Adoption of "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes"

The Company has adopted "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes" (ASBJ Statement No. 27, issued on October 28, 2022, hereinafter referred to as "Revised Accounting Standard 2022") since the beginning of the current fiscal year.

Previously, the Company posted income taxes in profit or loss and calculated them in accordance with laws and regulations. In accordance with the Revised Accounting Standard 2022, the Company has classified income taxes into profit or loss, shareholders' equity, and comprehensive income depending on the source of the transaction. When a transaction occurs that results in income taxes classified in accumulated other comprehensive income, the Company records the corresponding amount of income taxes in earnings.

When a taxable transaction relates to profit or loss as well as shareholders' equity or other comprehensive income, and it is difficult to calculate the amount of income taxes imposed on shareholders' equity or other comprehensive income, the Company posts the tax amount solely in profit or loss.

With respect to the amendment to the classification of accounting for income taxes (taxation on other comprehensive income), the Company follows to the transitional treatment prescribed in the proviso of paragraph 3 of Article 20 of the Revised Accounting Standard 2022. The Revised Accounting Standard 2022 articulates that an amount of cumulative effect of adopting the new accounting policy retroactively shall be added to or subtracted from retained earnings at the beginning of the first year of adoption. The corresponding amount shall be added to or subtracted from capital surplus, valuation and translation adjustments, or accumulated other comprehensive income. The Company also follows to the transitional treatment prescribed in the proviso of paragraph 2 (2) of Article 65 of "Implementation Guidance on Tax Effect Accounting" (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, issued on October 28, 2022. Hereinafter referred to as the "Implementation Guidance 2022"). The Implementation Guidance 2022 stipulates that an amount of cumulative effect of adopting the new accounting policy retroactively shall be added to or subtracted from retained earnings at the beginning of the first year of adoption, and the corresponding amount shall be added to or subtracted from capital surplus. The change in accounting policy was not material to the consolidated financial statements for the current fiscal year.

In addition, the revision related to the review of the treatment in the consolidated financial statements in the case of deferring a profit or loss in tax purposes arising from the sale of subsidiary shares, etc. among consolidated companies, the Company has adopted the Implementation Guidance 2022 from the beginning of the current fiscal year. The change in accounting policy was retroactively applied to the Company's consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year. However, the change in accounting policy was not material to the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year.
