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1. Overview of Operating Results, etc.

(1) Overview of Operating Results for the Six Months Ended September 30, 2025

At present, the Group provides a wide range of human resources (HR) related services including temporary staffing and placement service in Japan. In addition, in the Asia-Pacific (APAC) region, the Group operates staffing business and facility management business, etc.

Amid the ongoing labor shortage in Japan, the Group has been proactive in executing its operations with a focus on Staffing and Career Strategic Business Units (SBUs) as its mainstay businesses, against a backdrop of steady demand for hiring among its corporate clients. In addition, the Group moved ahead by positioning Career SBU, BPO SBU, and Technology SBU, which it positioned as pillars of profit growth, as the domains of focus in accordance with the policy under the PERSOL Group Mid-term Management Plan 2026. As a result, during the six months ended September 30, 2025, Group-wide revenue reached 752,741 million yen (up 4.9% year on year), with all SBUs posting increased revenue, with the exception of the Asia Pacific SBU, which posted decreased revenue under the impact of exchange rates. On the profit front, gross profit increased steadily, and Group-wide adjusted EBITDA was 44,347 million yen (up 3.7% year on year). Operating profit amounted to 36,603 million yen (up 14.0% year on year). Profit before tax amounted to 35,974 million yen (up 12.4% year on year). Profit attributable to owners of parent was 23,976 million yen (up 12.1% year on year), despite the absence of a corporation tax refund of 1,366 million yen recorded at the Asia Pacific SBU in the three months ended June 30, 2024.

a. Staffing SBU

This segment mainly operates the temporary staffing business in Japan, which covers a wide range of industries, mainly in the clerical area, as well as the placement business mainly for clerical positions. Revenue for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was 303,412 million yen (up 3.7% year on year), adjusted EBITDA was 18,227 million yen (up 7.4% year on year), and operating profit was 16,760 million yen (up 8.7% year on year).

Revenue increased, primarily reflecting a 2.2% year-on-year increase in the number of temporary staff employed and 2.1% year-on-year increase in charge price. Adjusted EBITDA and operating profit increased due to the contribution of the growth of the high-margin placement business, in addition to the effects of increased revenue.

As a result of the partial transfer of businesses of the Staffing SBU to Others in the six months ended September 30, 2025, year-on-year comparisons are also made with figures for the six months ended September 30, 2024 that have been prepared based on the revised classification method.

b. BPO SBU

This segment mainly operates as a contracted business process outsourcing (BPO) business.

Revenue for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was 69,762 million yen (up 27.8% year on year), adjusted EBITDA was 3,715 million yen (up 53.4% year on year), and operating profit was 2,440 million yen (up 62.7% year on year).

Revenue increased, partly due to the contribution of PERSOL COMMUNICATION SERVICES LIMITED (formerly Fujitsu Communication Services Limited), which was acquired in February 2025, in addition to organic growth (up 8.3% year on year). Adjusted EBITDA and operating profit also increased due to the effect of increased revenue.

c. Technology SBU

This segment operates design and development contracting business in IT and engineering areas and temporary staffing business specialized in engineers.

Revenue for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was 60,327 million yen (up 10.2% year on year), adjusted EBITDA was 3,361 million yen (down 3.6% year on year), and operating profit was 2,687 million yen (down 10.7% year on year).

Revenue increased mainly because the IT/DX solutions business and the engineering business saw growth in the number of operating engineers, reflecting the ongoing strengthening of engineer recruitment, and because demand in the outsourcing business grew. However, adjusted EBITDA and operating profit decreased due to delays in certain intra-group projects in the IT/DX solutions business.

d. Career SBU

This segment mainly operates placement business and job recruitment media business, supporting corporate clients' mid-career hiring activities.

Revenue for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was 77,803 million yen (up 6.8% year on year), adjusted EBITDA was 19,945 million yen (up 18.7% year on year), and operating profit was 17,019 million yen (up 17.4% year on year).

Revenue increased on the back of robust recruitment demand, despite the ongoing trends of careful selection of human resources by client companies and the cautious stance of job seekers. Regarding expenses, the active marketing investment initiated in the second half of the previous fiscal year was maintained, whilst personnel and other expenses continued to be kept at an appropriate level. As a result, adjusted EBITDA and operating profit rose, reflecting the effects of increased revenue combined with improved productivity.

e. Asia Pacific SBU

This segment mainly operates staffing business in Asia and staffing business and facility management business in Australia.

Revenue for the six months ended September 30, 2025 was 236,613 million yen (down 0.3% year on year), adjusted EBITDA was 5,809 million yen (down 17.9% year on year), and operating profit was 3,889 million yen (up 6.1% year on year).

Revenue decreased mainly due to the impact of the foreign exchange rate; however, the facility management business in particular continued to perform strongly and, on a local currency basis, revenue increased. Adjusted EBITDA declined due to the impact of the foreign exchange rate in addition to temporary factors such as a decrease in profit resulting from the difference in subsidies recorded in the three months ended June 30, 2024 and those recorded in the three months ended June 30, 2025, as well as increased costs associated with s

ystem renewal. However, operating profit increased due to the impact of accrued paid leave included in adjustment items.

(2) Overview of Financial Position as of September 30, 2025

(i) Assets, Liabilities and Equity

Total assets increased 22,856 million yen compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. Current assets increased 19,683 million yen, and non-current assets rose 3,172 million yen. The increase in current assets chiefly reflected an increase of 15,171million yen in cash and cash equivalents. The increase was partially offset by a decrease of 2,458 million yen in trade and other receivables. The increase in non-current assets is mainly due to increases of 2,082 million yen in intangible assets and 1,701 million yen in other financial assets.

Liabilities increased 3,384 million yen compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. Current liabilities increased 15,510 million yen while non-current liabilities decreased 12,125 million yen. This resulted mainly because bonds and borrowings increased by 20,000 million yen under current liabilities and decreased by 10,000 million yen under non-current liabilities.

Equity increased 19,471 million yen compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase of 12,833 million yen in retained earnings, which resulted primarily from the recording of 23,976 million yen in profit attributable to owners of parent and the payment of 11,092 million yen in dividends of surplus.

(ii) Business and Financial Issues to Address

The six months ended September 30, 2025 saw no significant change in business and financial issues that the Group should address.

(iii) Cash Flows

Cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter "capital") as of September 30, 2025 was 97,989 million yen, up 15,171 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year.

Presented below are an overview of cash flows for the six months ended September 30, 2025 and main factors behind them.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Capital generated as a result of operating activities was 33,593 million yen (as compared to 19,921 million yen generated in the same period of the previous fiscal year). Major factors were a profit before tax of 35,974 million yen and depreciation and amortization of 17,352 million yen, while income taxes paid amounted to 14,459 million yen.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Capital used as a result of investing activities was 7,573 million yen (as compared to 7,419 million yen used in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to spending of 6,338 million yen on the purchase of intangible assets.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Capital used as a result of financing activities was 11,196 million yen (as compared to 42,894 million yen used in the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was mainly due to the repayments of short-term borrowings of 20,000 million yen, the repayments of long-term borrowings of 10,000 million yen, and dividends paid of 11,093 million yen. Meanwhile, proceeds from short-term borrowings amounted to 40,000 million yen.

(Segment Information)

(1) Overview of reportable segments

The reportable segments are constituent parts of the Group for each of which separate financial information is available. The Board regularly reviews operations in each reportable segment to evaluate performance and determine the distribution of management resources.

The Group aims to enhance its ability to formulate and pursue strategies, clarify responsibilities, make agile management decisions in response to rapidly changing business environments, and achieve further growth. To this end, the Group has five reportable segments: Staffing, BPO, Technology, Career and Asia Pacific.

(Changes in reportable segments)

As a result of a group-wide reorganization, some businesses of the Staffing SBU were transferred to Others as of April 1, 2025. In addition, certain businesses previously included in Others were reclassified to Adjustments, which are not attributable to any reportable segment, effective August 1, 2025. The segment information for the previous interim consolidated accounting period has been recalculated based on the revised classification method.

(Business combination through acquisition)

At the meeting of the Board that was held on October 1, 2025, the Company resolved to acquire shares of Gojob SAS and make it a subsidiary, and the Company acquired the shares on October 1, 2025.

(1) Outline of business combination

(i) Overview of the acquired company

Acquired company: Gojob SAS (hereinafter referred to as "Gojob")

Business: AI-driven staffing platform

(ii) Main reason for business combination

The Company aims to achieve the PERSOL Group Vision, "Work and Smile," based on its corporate philosophy: "Providing Opportunity", "Individual Growth" and "Social Contribution". Under the ongoing "Mid-Term Management Plan 2026," the Company has made the evolution into a technology-driven HR service company as its management policy, aiming to achieve non-continuous growth through products and digitalization. As a part of this policy, the Company has decided to acquire Gojob SAS, a company possessing highly scalable products.

Gojob SAS demonstrates strong competitiveness in the digital field with a tech team that possesses cutting-edge AI technologies. It possesses high technological capabilities, evidenced by its selection as one of "Next40," namely the 40 most promising startups, under the French government's startup support program "French Tech". In FY2024, Gojob recorded the highest rate of sales growth among French human resources service companies, demonstrating an exceptionally strong growth track record with a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of approximately 40% over the past four years. Another significant strength is its highly scalable business model. This is evidenced by the fact that Gojob has built a highly scalable platform that can be adapted flexibly across countries, regions, and job domains. It has entered the United States, the world's largest market, at an early stage despite being a European company.

The Company is aware that progress in AI technologies has created a risk that conventional business models will be forced to change. Reflecting these changes in circumstances, the Company believes it essential to make ongoing investment in new technology-driven businesses both domestically and internationally, in addition to achieving steady growth in its core domestic businesses such as temporary staffing and placement business. This share acquisition will accelerate the transition to the digital model that the Company intends to make. The Company positions this as an important initiative aimed at strengthening its digital platform business and achieving significant growth beyond 2030 by taking on challenges in the markets of Europe and the United States.

Gojob plans to conduct a third-party allotment of new shares to its employees by March 2027. All the shares currently not held by the Company, including the ones to be issued, carry a future right to sell to the Company (put option) held by non-controlling shareholders and a future right to buy from non-controlling shareholders (call option) held by the Company. It is expected that the Company will acquire 100% of the outstanding shares of Gojob by March 2029 after the above options are exercised.
