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1. Overview of operating results and others

(1) Overview of operating results for the period

During the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), the Japanese economy showed a moderate recovery trend, backed by improved conditions in the employment/income environment, an increase in corporate capital investment and other factors. On the other hand, the outlook remains uncertain due to persistently high raw material and energy prices caused by unstable international conditions, the U.S. policy trends including trade policy, and the risk of downward pressure on consumer confidence due to rising prices.

In this environment, the Group focused on deriving correct information from a large amount of information and efficiently delivering that information to those who need it, based on its mission "Efficiently Connecting Accurate Information," resulting in the following consolidated operating results.

For the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), net sales were \(\frac{4}{20}\), 812 million (down 6.5% year on year).

For "Affiliate Marketing," pay-per-performance advertising service, sales increased year on year mainly due to growth in the shopping category, while sales decreased significantly year on year due to the termination of the transaction agreement with respect to "StoreMatch" pay-per-click advertising for stores in the online shopping mall and "STORE's Roo" CRM tool (collectively, "Both Services") as of July 31, 2025.

Selling, general and administrative expenses were ¥4,096 million (down 4.3% year on year).

Operating income was \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2},189\) million (down 29.9% year on year) due to lower sales resulting from the termination of transaction agreement related to Both Services.

This was mainly due to the recording of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{1,025}\) million of gain on service transition operations, as well as the recording of impairment losses of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{246}\) million and income taxes of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{531}\) million in the second quarter of the fiscal year, following a review of future earnings forecasts for some services in the Marketing Solutions Business and "DYNA PMS," a hotel management system in the Travel Tech Business, among other products and services.

Segment performance was as follows:

The classifications of reportable segments have been changed effective from the second quarter of the fiscal year, and the following year-on-year comparisons are comparative analyses based on figures for the same quarter of the previous fiscal year that have been restated into figures for the segment classifications after the change.

(i) Marketing Solutions Business

Marketing Solutions Business provides solutions that support attracting customers and promoting sales of commerce business operators. Its main service is that of "Affiliate Marketing" pay-per-performance advertising.

In "Affiliate Marketing" during the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), although there was growth in the shopping category and other factors, which boosted sales, there was a year-on-year decrease in segment operating income due to a higher cost rate, strategic investments made in new business areas, and other factors. As a result, this segment attained net sales of \(\frac{1}{2}\)9.88 million (up 4.0% year on year) and segment operating income of \(\frac{1}{2}\)976 million (down 27.3% year on year).

(ii) EC Solutions Business

EC Solutions Business provides pay-per-click advertising and CRM tool for stores in the online shopping mall. Its main services are the provision of "StoreMatch" pay-per-click advertising, and "STORE's $R\infty$ " CRM tool for stores in the online shopping mall operated by Yahoo Japan Corporation, both of which were terminated as of July 31, 2025.

For the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), this segment attained net sales of ¥9,831 million (down 16.1% year on year) and segment operating income of ¥2,672 million (down 16.8% year on year) due to the termination of transaction agreement related to Both Services.

(iii) Travel Tech Business

Travel Tech Business provides solutions to attract customers to accommodation facilities and support DX. Its main services are "DYNA IBE," an accommodation reservation system, and "DYNA PMS," a hotel management system. Effective September 1, 2025, "Direct In," an accommodation reservation system, and "Dynalution," an accommodation management system, have been renamed to "DYNA IBE," an accommodation reservation system, and "DYNA PMS," a hotel management system, respectively.

During the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), net sales increased year on year due in part to a recovery in the willingness of accommodation facilities to invest, but the Company posted a segment operating loss due to strategic investments in new business areas, etc. As a result, this segment attained net sales of \(\frac{

(2) Overview of financial positions for the period

(i) The status of assets, liabilities and net assets

Assets

At the end of the third quarter of the fiscal year, total assets amounted to \$17,950 million, a decrease of \$1,641 million from the end of the previous fiscal year.

Current assets amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{15,282}\) million, a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,360}\) million from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease in notes and accounts receivable - trade of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1,988}\) million.

Non-current assets amounted to \(\frac{\pma}{2}\),667 million, an increase of \(\frac{\pma}{7}\)18 million from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to increases in investment securities of \(\frac{\pma}{3}\)19 million and other of investments and other assets of \(\frac{\pma}{4}\)473 million.

Liabilities

At the end of the third quarter of the fiscal year, total liabilities amounted to \(\frac{\pma}{3}\),963 million, a decrease of \(\frac{\pma}{2}\),767 million from the end of the previous fiscal year.

Current liabilities amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{3}\),963 million, a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{2}\),708 million from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to decreases in accounts payable - trade of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{1}\),232 million, accounts payable - other of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{7}\)52 million and income taxes payable of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{5}\)72 million.

Net assets

At the end of the third quarter of the fiscal year, total net assets amounted to \(\xi\$13,986 million, an increase of \(\xi\$1,126 million from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase in recording of net income attributable to owners of parent of \(\xi\$2,293 million, despite a decrease in retained earnings of \(\xi\$1,235 million as a result of a dividend of surplus.

(ii) Cash flows

The cash flows and their causes during the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative), are as follows.

Cash flows from operating activities

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to \$1,931 million (compared to net cash provided of \$2,477 million during the third quarter of the previous fiscal year), mainly due to income before income taxes of \$2,824 million. Positive factors include depreciation and amortization of \$274 million and a decrease in accounts receivable - trade of \$1,991 million. Negative factors include a decrease in accounts payable - trade of \$1,232 million, a decrease in accounts payable - other of \$768 million, and income taxes paid of \$1,174 million.

Cash flows from investing activities

Net cash used in investing activities amounted to \$1,035 million (compared to net cash used of \$527 million during the third quarter of the previous fiscal year), mainly due to purchase of intangible assets of \$257 million, purchase of investment securities of \$419 million and purchase of shares of subsidiaries resulting in change in scope of consolidation of \$196 million.

Cash flows from financing activities

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to \$1,227 million (compared to net cash used of \$12,445 million during the third quarter of the previous fiscal year), mainly due to dividends paid of \$1,226 million.

(Significant changes in the scope of consolidation)

During the second quarter of the fiscal year, Dynatech Inc., which was a consolidated subsidiary, was excluded from the scope of consolidation as it was dissolved in an absorption-type merger with the Company as the surviving company.

(Significant changes in the scope of application of equity method)

During the second quarter of the fiscal year, StyleDoubler Ltd. was included in the scope of application of equity method as the Company acquired its shares.

(Notes - Changes in accounting policies)

(Application of the "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes," etc.)

The Company has applied the "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes" (Accounting Standards Board of Japan (ASBJ) Statement No. 27, October 28, 2022; the "Revised Accounting Standard of 2022") and other relevant ASBJ regulations from the beginning of the first quarter of the fiscal year.

Revisions to categories for recording current income taxes (taxation on other comprehensive income) conform to the transitional treatment in the proviso of paragraph 20-3 of the Revised Accounting Standard of 2022 and to the transitional treatment in the proviso of paragraph 65-2(2) of the "Guidance on Accounting Standard for Tax Effect Accounting" (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, October 28, 2022; the "Revised Guidance of 2022"). This does not affect the quarterly consolidated financial statements.

In addition, for changes related to the revised treatment in consolidated financial statements when a gain or loss on sale arising from the sale of shares of subsidiaries, etc. among consolidated companies is deferred for tax purposes, the Revised Guidance of 2022 has been applied from the beginning of the first quarter of the fiscal year. This change in accounting policies has been applied retrospectively, and is reflected in the quarterly consolidated financial statements for the same period of the previous fiscal year and the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year. This does not affect the quarterly consolidated financial statements for the same period of the previous fiscal year and the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year.

(Changes in useful lives)

The Company resolved its head office relocation at the meeting of its Board of Directors held on June 27, 2025. Accordingly, the useful lives of non-current assets that will no longer be usable due to the relocation of the head office have been shortened, and this change has been applied prospectively.

The impact of this change on profit or loss for the third quarter of the fiscal year (cumulative) is minimal.
