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1. Qualitative Information about the Half-yearly Financial Results

Overview of Operating Results

(1) Overview of Half-yearly Operating Results

During the first half of the current consolidated period, with improvement in employment and income conditions, Japan saw its economy gradually improve. However, the economic outlook remains uncertain because of concerns about the United States' trade policy and souring consumer sentiment attributed to rising prices, among other factors.

In the reuse industry, the whole market continues to grow as the notion of sustainability has become part of public awareness, and rising prices have been stimulating demand for reusable items, expanding the user base.

During the first half of the current consolidated accounting period, the Treasure Factory Group enjoyed steady business that continued from the previous period. We achieved an operating profit of ¥423 million over the second quarter of the consolidated accounting period from June to August, which was a record figure for our operating profit earned in the second quarter of a consolidated accounting period. We opened 18 new directly-managed stores and 2 franchise stores. Our existing stores also enjoyed steady sales.

Consequently, the results of operations for the first half of the current consolidated accounting period show net sales of 22,453 million (up 14.5 percent year on year), operating profit of 1,919 million (up 10.0 percent year on year), ordinary profit of 1,929 million (up 11.5 percent year on year), and half-yearly profit of 1,239 million attributable to owners of the parent (up 8.2 percent year on year).

The results of operations sorted by segment are as stated below.

(Reuse Business)

Consolidated sales increased 14.4 percent year on year, and non-consolidated sales at existing stores increased 4.3 percent year on year. In terms of sales by category, apparel sales increased 19.5% year on year because demand for outfits for going out grew. The sales of electric appliances increased 2.7 percent year on year as the business responded to new lifestyle-related demands in March and April as well as to demand for summer home appliances from June through August. Fashion items, such as branded items and wristwatches and hobby-related items such as outdoor and sporting goods, enjoyed strong sales and achieved a significant increase of 14.4 percent year on year and of 13.0 percent year on year, respectively. EC sales increased 19.7 percent year on year.

Consolidated purchases of merchandise for the fiscal year under review increased 21.8 percent year on year. As for purchases by channel, in-store purchases continued to steadily grow, achieving an increase of 20.8 percent year on year (non-consolidated). Home-delivery purchases and home-visit purchases also enjoyed an increase of 3.2 percent year on year (non-consolidated) and of 17.9 percent year on year (non-consolidated), respectively.

During the first half of the current consolidated accounting period, we opened 9 general reuse stores, 6 fashion reuse stores, 1 fashion outlet reuse store, 1 brand-name item reuse store, and 1 musical instrument reuse store, the total being 18 directly-managed stores. As for franchise stores, we opened 2 fashion reuse stores. As for the number of stores by region, we opened 1 directly-managed store in Tohoku, 11 in Kanto, 1 in Tokai, 2 in Kansai, 2 in Chugoku, and 1 in Kyushu, along with 2 franchise stores in Kansai. The number of stores at the end of the first half of the consolidated accounting period are 278 directly-managed stores and 32 franchise stores, 310 in total across the Group.

These results added up to net sales of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\text{2}}}{21,864}\) million (up 14.4 percent year on year) and a segment profit of \(\frac{\pmathbf{\text{2}}}{2,894}\) million (up 4.9 percent year on year).

(Other)

The rental business's sales increased 9.5 percent year on year.

These results added up to net sales of \(\frac{\pman}{805}\) million (up 15.8 percent year on year) and a segment profit of \(\frac{\pman}{25}\) million (the same period of the previous year saw a segment loss of \(\frac{\pman}{2}\) million).

(2) Overview of Half-yearly Financial Position

Total assets at the end of the first half of the current consolidated accounting period increased by ¥1,471 million compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, totaling ¥22,301 million because of a decrease of ¥473 million in cash and deposits, an increase of ¥125 million in accounts receivable-trade, an increase of ¥1,195 million in merchandise, an increase of ¥279 million in buildings and structures (net), an increase of ¥199 million in leasehold and guarantee deposits, among other reasons.

Total liabilities at the end of the first half of the current consolidated accounting period increased by ¥609 million compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, totaling ¥10,936 million because of an increase of ¥166 million in short-term borrowings, an increase of ¥201 million in current portion of long-term borrowings, an increase of ¥39 million in provision for bonuses, a decrease of ¥148 million in income taxes payable, and an increase of ¥262 million in long-term borrowings, among other reasons.

Total net assets at the end of the first half of the current consolidated accounting period increased by ¥861 million compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, totaling ¥11,364 million because a half-yearly profit of ¥1,238 million attributable to owners of the parent was recorded, and dividend payment led to a decrease of ¥421 million, among other reasons.

(Analysis of cash flows)

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the first half of the current consolidated accounting period decreased by ¥473 million compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, totaling ¥2,531 million. The status of the cash flows during the first half of the current consolidated accounting period and their factors are as follows.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Cash flows from operating activities during the first half of the current consolidated accounting period added up to an income of ¥329 million (the same period of the previous year saw an income of ¥1,256 million). This is mostly because we recorded an increase of ¥1,194 million in inventories and paid income taxes of ¥814 million, whereas we also recorded ¥1,959 million in profit before income taxes and ¥368 million in depreciation.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Cash flows from investing activities during the first half of the current consolidated accounting period added up to an expenditure of ¥1,023 million (the same period of the previous year saw an expenditure of ¥909 million). This is mostly because we recorded ¥685 million in purchase of property, plant, and equipment, along with ¥284 million in payments of leasehold and guarantee deposits, to establish new stores.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Cash flows from financing activities during the first half of the current consolidated accounting period added up to an income of ¥218 million (the same period of the previous year saw an expenditure of ¥346 million). This is mostly because we recorded ¥636 million in repayments of long-term borrowings and ¥421 million in dividends paid, whereas we also recorded ¥1,100 million in proceeds from long-term borrowings and ¥166 million in short-term borrowings.

The full-year consolidated forecasts for the fiscal year ending February 28, 2026 remain unchanged from the figures released by the Company on April 9, 2025.
