1. Qualitative information on the current interim financial results

(1) Qualitative information on the consolidated financial results

In the current interim consolidated accounting period under review, the Japanese economy was on a moderate recovery trend, as socioeconomic activities normalized and the employment and income situation improved. On the other hand, the continued rise in prices has brought a cautious stance toward private consumption, and the outlook remains uncertain due to factors such as developments in energy prices and raw material prices stemming from geopolitical risks, as well as exchange rate fluctuations.

In this environment, in the restaurant industry, the recovery in people's flow became firmly established, and inbound demand accompanying the increase in the number of foreign visitors to Japan recovered strongly, mainly in urban areas and tourist destinations. In addition, an increase in the unit price per customer due to the revision of menu prices contributed to continued recovery in industry sales. On the other hand, in addition to rising prices for rice and other grains and other foodstuffs, we are still experiencing strong upward pressure on costs throughout the supply chain, including personnel, logistics and energy costs. Coupled with consumers' desire to save, we continue to face a challenging business environment.

In this business environment, as stated in the Medium-Term Management Plan (disclosed on April 14, 2025), which began this fiscal year, our Group implemented the following initiatives during the second quarter of the fiscal year under review based on the 3 Growth pillars: Evolution of intrinsic value, Synergistic M&A, and Expansion of overseas business, as well as the 3 Foundations for Growth supporting these initiatives: Technology utilization, Promotion of human capital management, and Sustainability promotion.

- Improve profitability by strengthening the growth base: Established FastWorks Inc.(June)

 We established FastWorks Inc., a functional company responsible for managing store design and construction planning, with the purpose of reinforcing our earnings base to support sustainable growth. As a result, we will promote in-house design and construction management functions and consolidate our business partners to strengthen cost competitiveness and increase the speed of store openings. Looking ahead, we will consider receiving orders from outside the Group and cultivate them as a new source of revenues.
- Develop new business formats that embody the evolution of intrinsic value and expand brand portfolio

 In order to further evolve our diverse food brands, which are the Group's strengths, we reopened KINOZEN, a long-established sweetener shop with a 160-year history, in Kagurazaka, Tokyo (July). They have joined our group's portfolio as a high-value-added brand by inheriting the "tastes" and "feelings" of the tradition, along with the red-bean-paste craftsman who have devoted themselves for many years. Furthermore, with the purpose of capturing the demands for takeout and prepared meals, and approaching new customer segments, we opened the bakery brand mugi bagel in Meguro, Tokyo (August) and propose new food options for diverse lifestyles with "Mugyu-mochi" texture bakery.
- Initiatives to Co-Create Value with Shareholders

 On September 1, 2025, the Company conducted a 2-for-1 stock split of its common stock with the purpose of enhancing the liquidity of its shares and expanding its investor base with the aim of building better relationships with shareholders. In addition, we decided to expand the shareholder benefit plan (based on the record as of the end of February 2026) in order to respond to the daily support of our shareholders.

In addition to the steady implementation of these initiatives, the Company succeeded in steady growth (in same-store sales YoY: 102.5%), strategic store openings centered on core brands, and business format changes and renovations that make maximum use of intra-group resources.

As a consequence, our business results for the current interim consolidated accounting period were higher than the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year in terms of both revenue and Operating profit, as shown below.

(2) Qualitative information on the consolidated financial position

1) Assets, liabilities and equity

(Assets)

The balance of current assets at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period increased by 2,038 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated accounting year to 32,663 million yen. This was mainly due to a decrease of 767 million yen in cash and cash equivalents, despite an increase of 2,964 million yen in trade and other receivables.

The balance of non-current assets at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period increased by 687 million yen

from the end of the previous consolidated accounting year to 107,230 million yen. This was mainly due to an increase of 476 million yen in property, plant and equipment in fixed assets.

(Liabilities)

The balance of liabilities at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period increased by 266 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated accounting year to 93,446 million yen. This was mainly due to decreases of 1,374 million yen in bonds and borrowings and 278 million yen in lease liabilities, while there were increases of 1,276 million yen in accrued expenses and 749 million yen in trade and other payables included in other current liabilities.

(Equity)

The balance of equity at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period increased by 2,458 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated accounting year to 46,448 million yen. This was mainly due to an increase of 2,353 million yen in retained earnings.

Ratio of equity attributable to owners of parent (equity ratio) is 30.4%.

2) Consolidated results of cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter referred to as "Net cash") at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period decreased by 767 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year to 20,706 million yen.

The status of each cash flow during the current interim consolidated accounting period and its factors are as follows.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities was 11,279 million yen (decrease of 13.2% YoY). This was mainly due to recording of depreciation and amortization of 8,075 billion yen and interim profit before tax of 5,132 million yen.

(Cash flow from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities for the current interim consolidated accounting period was 2,854 million yen (decrease of 52.4% YoY). This was mainly due to purchase of property, plant and equipment in fixed assets of 2,511 million yen.

(Cash flow from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to 9,248 billion yen (up 9.7% YoY). This was mainly due to repayments of lease liabilities of 6,874 million yen and repayments of long-term loans payable of 3,803 million yen.

3) Qualitative information on the consolidated business forecasts

The full-year consolidated earnings forecasts for the fiscal year ending February 2026 are unchanged from those announced on April 14, 2025.

The business results for the current interim consolidated accounting period were solid, thanks in part to the ongoing capture of demand on special occasions and the effects of various measures in line with the medium-term management plan.

However, in the second half of the fiscal year, in addition to geopolitical risks and exchange rate fluctuations attributable to unstable global situations, raw material prices and energy costs are expected to remain at high levels. In addition, the impact of long-term price rises on consumer sentiment also needs to be monitored closely.

In light of these uncertainties in the business environment, based on a comprehensive consideration of the results up to the current interim consolidated accounting period and future risk factors, we have decided to leave the previously announced results forecasts unchanged at this time.

In the second half of the fiscal year, our Group will continue to strive to improve productivity on a company-wide basis. At the same time, we will focus on providing products and services that customers will feel value. By steadily implementing the growth strategies outlined in the Medium-Term Management Plan, we will aim to achieve our full-year earnings forecasts.

These forecasts are based on currently available information, and actual results may differ from these forecasts due to various factors. We will promptly disclose any revisions to our business forecasts that we deem necessary in the future.
