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1. Overview of operating results

(1) Overview of operating results during the period

1) Operating results during the period

During the consolidated fiscal year ended September 30, 2025, the Japanese economy saw a gradual recovery in economic activity, due to factors including a recovery in personal consumption accompanying wage increases, and an increase in foreign tourist demand. Meanwhile, the outlook remains uncertain due to factors such as global political instability and price increases resulting from the longer-than-expected depreciation in the yen.

The restaurant sector also continued to face challenging conditions due to soaring prices for rice and other raw materials and energy, as well as chronic labor shortages.

Under such circumstances, FOOD & LIFE COMPANIES LTD. worked to enhance product development, in-store food preparation, and health and safety initiatives and services with 'Discovering new tastiness, Sharing moments of joy' as our vision, and the desire to surprise and move our customers with delicious sushi.

As a result, revenue for the consolidated fiscal year ended September 30, 2025 totaled 429,574 million yen (+19.0% year on year), operating profit 36,093 million yen (+54.4% year on year), profit before income taxes 33,777 million yen (+56.0% year on year), and profit for the period attributable to owners of the parent 22,937 million yen (+56.7% year on year). Both revenue and profits reached record highs for the consolidated fiscal year.

Operating results by segment are as follows.

(Japan Sushiro Business)

During the consolidated fiscal year ended September 30, 2025, Japan Sushiro under the theme of "Mastering the Art of Sushi!" focused on the deliciousness that it has been dedicated to since its foundation, and worked to provide products and campaigns that would satisfy our customers.

During the summer vacation period starting from mid-July, our "Once-a-Year Exceptional Tuna Festival," endorsed by three famous sushi chefs, was a great success. Sushiro sold carefully selected large-cut albacore tuna sushi (starting from 110 yen w/tax), and also held our all-time popular red-vinegared sushi rice campaign. We also collaborated with "HAPIDANBUI," a Sanrio character unit loved by all generations, and "BTS Island: In the SEOM," a puzzle adventure game developed with the participation of the globally popular group BTS. Four of our domestic stores (in Tokyo, Aichi, and Osaka prefectures) were transformed into special collaboration stores where customers could enjoy the world of BTS Island: In the SEOM. This was part of our ongoing effort to provide content that can be enjoyed alongside our sushi. Additionally, we made steady progress in rolling out 'Digital Sushiro Vision (known as 'Digiro' for short),' digitally recreating the fun of discovering and choosing sushi on the revolving lane which used to be a key feature of revolving sushi restaurant. By the end of the consolidated fiscal year, we had completed the implementation of 'Digiro' in 123 stores in Japan.

As a result of the above, net sales of the Japan Sushiro Business were 265,903 million yen, (+11.6% year on year) and segment profit was 18,008 million yen (26.7% year on year).

(International Sushiro Business)

The International Sushiro Business has been expanding steadily, driven by a selective approach to opening new locations based on carefully chosen properties and sites. In Southeast Asia, our fourth market, Malaysia, saw a huge response to its first store opening in February. We even received letters of thanks from customers who had long been waiting for a Sushiro to open, and the store has continued to perform well. Meanwhile, the business in Mainland China has moved beyond the recovery trend of the previous fiscal year (FY24) and entered a phase of expansion/growth this fiscal year (FY25). We are steadily increasing the store count and maintaining high performance levels, indicating that the strong momentum in our international Sushiro business continues. To further increase customer count, we've carried out attractive promotional and marketing initiatives in each region. In Singapore, our July 'Summer Festival' featured the luxurious "Sushiya no Unagyu" (grilled eel and beef), perfect for the hot summer. In Taiwan, 'Late Summer Flavor Fair' of August offered 'Salmon Mountain,' a must-try for salmon fans. In Hong Kong, we collaborated with 'Ninomae Ina'nis,' a very popular VTuber from 'hololive English,' to continuously provide customers with a high-value dining experience.

As a result of the above, net sales of the International Sushiro Business were 131,420 million yen (+42.6% year on year) and segment profit was 16,324 million yen (+126.9% year on year).

(Kyotaru Business)

The Kyotaru brand continued to strengthen its e-commerce sales and to close unprofitable stores to further improve profitability. Kyotaru brand carried out back-to-back campaigns offering seasonal items at value prices. In September, coinciding with "Respect for the Aged Day," we offered a special celebratory bento box for a limited three-day period. This bento contained a selection of Kyotaru's best, including cute, bite-sized sushi and norimaki (rolled sushi). The Misaki brand also held its own "Always a Great Deal Fair" throughout August. In addition, we ran a special promotion titled "Midsummer Sushi Festival" where customers could participate in a prediction contest to guess which item – Hon-Maguro (Bluefin Tuna) or Nodoguro (Blackthroat Seaperch) – would have the highest total number of plates sold during the campaign. Furthermore, we conducted special anniversary promotions at new and some of the renovated stores, such as tuna cutting shows and other special sales, which were extremely well-received by our customers. Misaki performance had been strong throughout this fiscal year. Misaki will continue to work on enhancing its brand image by further improving the quality of its products and customer service, with the Misaki flagship store located in Ningyocho, Tokyo leading the action.

As a result of the above, net sales of the Kyotaru Business were 23,532 million yen (1.9% year on year) and segment loss was 60 million yen (segment loss was 350 million yen in the same period of previous fiscal year).

(Japan Sugidama Business)

Leveraging the strengths of FOOD & LIFE COMPANIES, the popular sushi izakaya restaurant "Sugidama" offers sushi that is meticulously crafted for freshness, taste, and appearance, along with classic izakaya dishes and drinks that pair perfectly with a meal. By successfully growing through a combination of company-owned and franchise locations, Sugidama's domestic store count approached 100, reaching 95 stores as of the end of this fiscal year - its eighth year in business. We consistently run promotional campaigns to make dining even more enjoyable in our Japanese-style, modern and unique interiors. For example, during the "Sugidama Collection 2025 Summer" campaign, we offered popular menu items at a special limited-time prices. We also sold "Maguro no Ohagi," a tuna dish featuring medium fatty tuna that the president of Sugidama endorsed, during the "Sugidama Autumn Festival." These efforts reflect our commitment to creating an experience that makes customers want to return. As results of the above, net sales of the Japan Sugidama Business were 8,284 million yen (+20.1% year on year) and segment profit was 64 million yen (-51.1% year on year).

2) Outlook for the next period

The Company forecasts revenue of 485,000 million yen (+12.9% year on year), adjusted EBITDA of 59,500 million yen (+14.2% year on year), operating profit of 40,500 million yen (+12.2% year on year), and profit for the year attributable to owners of the parent of 24,000 million yen (+4.6% year on year).

(2) Overview of financial position during the period

1) Assets, liabilities and equity

(Assets)

The balance of total assets increased 33,441 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 398,596 million yen.

The balance of current assets increased 13,740 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 88,396 million yen. This mainly reflected a 10,127 million yen increase in cash and cash equivalents.

The balance of non-current assets increased 19,701 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 310,200 million yen. This mainly reflected a 18,884 million yen increase in property, plant and equipment.

(Liabilities)

Total liabilities increased 10,377 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 297,694 million yen.

The balance of current liabilities decreased 4,013 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 84,857 million yen. This mainly reflected a 5,000 million yen decrease in bonds and borrowings, alongside a 6,522 million yen increase in trade and other payables, and a 2,161 million yen increase in lease liabilities.

The balance of non-current liabilities increased 6,363 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 212,837 million yen. This mainly reflected a 3,609 million yen increase in lease liabilities and a 1,005 million yen increase in bonds and borrowings.

(Equity)

Total equity increased 23,064 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 100,902 million yen. This mainly reflected a 3,394 million yen resulting from cash dividends paid, alongside the booking of 22,937 million yen in profit for the period.

(3) Cash flows during the period

In the consolidated fiscal year ended September 30, 2025, cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter "Cash") increased 10,127 million yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to 58,822 million yen. The breakdown of cash flows by activities and underlying factors for the consolidated fiscal year ended September 30, 2025 is shown below.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Cash provided by operating activities totaled 64,429 million yen (+14.4% year on year).

This mainly reflected the booking of 33,777 million yen in profit before income taxes, the booking of 35,776 million yen in depreciation and amortization, a 1,213 million yen in impairment losses and a 6,287 million yen increase in trade and other payables, alongside a 3,720 million yen increase in inventories and a 8,257 million yen in income tax paid.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Cash used in investing activities came to 25,436 million yen (+5.7% year on year).

This was mainly attributable to 25,177 million yen in purchase of property, plant and equipment.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Cash used in financing activities amounted to 29,235 million yen (14.8% year on year). This mainly reflected a 5,000 million yen in redemption for bonds, a 4,974 million yen in proceeds from issuance of bonds, a 22,117 million yen in repayments of lease liabilities and a 4,009 million yen in repayments of long-term borrowings.

(4) Basic policy on profit distribution, and dividends in current and next period

The Company regards the return of profits to its shareholders as an important management issue. Our basic policy is to continuously enhance performance and provide ongoing, appropriate profit distribution in line with performance. In terms of our dividend policy, we aim to provide stable dividends based on performance once a year as an apportionment of surplus while comprehensively taking into consideration matters such as earnings trends and the replenishment of internal reserves.

Internal reserves are used to fund aggressive investments to support the implementation of a range of measures geared toward strengthening our operating base.

Based on the above basic policy and after comprehensively considering the balance of business conditions during the current consolidated fiscal year and the return of profits to shareholders, the Company has decided to pay a year-end dividend of 35.00 yen per share for the fiscal year ended September 30, 2025.

In the next fiscal year, the Company plans an annual dividend per share of 35.00 yen assuming the outlook for the next period described on page 4 of the attached materials is achieved.

2. Basic thinking on selection of accounting standards

The Sushiro Group has adopted the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) since the year ended September 30, 2016 with the aim of enhancing the international comparability of its financial information in capital markets as well as overall convenience.
