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1. Overview of Operating Results, etc.

(1) Overview of Operating Results for the Period

As for the global economy during the nine months ended September 30, 2025, there was a sense of uncertainty as economic recovery slowed down, with some regions seemingly coming to a standstill and the impact of last-minute demand due to tariff hikes and the subsequent drop in demand was felt.

Looking ahead, the movement toward recovery may weaken as the impact of trade policy spreads. We need to pay attention to downside risks due to the impact of future U.S. policy trends including its trade policy, and the impact of fluctuations in financial and capital markets.

Under these circumstances, with its live game operations capability as a foundation, Nexon Group is centralizing its organizational structure around an IP Growth Initiative which can snowball growth within its established IP and develop new blockbusters. The new IP Growth Initiative is a strategy for creating vertical growth by revitalizing and extending established blockbusters such as *Dungeon&Fighter* and *MapleStory* with new content, on new platforms, and in new markets. The strategy includes hyperlocalization, a concept that recognizes the cultural differences between markets and deploys teams to customize content to match the unique player preferences in each region. Additionally, the strategy 's horizontal growth initiatives aim to develop new blockbusters from other Nexon Group games and franchises like *Mabinogi*, plus new games in development such as *ARC Raiders*.

For the nine months ended September 30, 2025, revenue declined year over year due to decreases in Dungeon&Fighter Mobile compared to its explosively successful launch in China in May 2024 and in The First Descendant compared to its launch in July 2024, despite revitalized momentum in key titles such as Dungeon&Fighter (PC) and MapleStory, contributions from MABINOGI MOBILE, which launched in March, and the successful regional expansion of MapleStory Worlds. Revenues by key franchises are as follows:

Dungeon&Fighter franchise revenue decreased year over year compared to *Dungeon&Fighter Mobile*'s launch in China a year ago, which was partially offset by growth from *Dungeon&Fighter* (PC). In Korea, *Dungeon&Fighter* (PC) significantly increased its revenue year over year. In China, a series of successful content updates drove year-over-year revenue growth.

MapleStory franchise revenue grew year over year driven by its PC version's strong performance in Korea and the regional expansion of *MapleStory Worlds*. Korea *MapleStory*'s revenue increased year over year driven by strong momentum from the summer updates. *MapleStory Worlds* expanded into Asia, excluding China and Japan, in April and significantly increased its year-over-year revenue.

FC franchise revenue was roughly flat year over year despite the absence of major professional soccer events in 2025.

As for other key titles, *MABINOGI MOBILE*'s solid performance since its launch in Korea on March 27 significantly contributed to the results.

In terms of expenses, costs increased year over year as the decrease in HR costs due to lower performance-based bonuses was surpassed by the increased royalty expenses for *MABINOGI MOBILE* and increased fees to creators for *MapleStory Worlds*. Selling, general and administrative expenses increased year over year primarily due to an increase in marketing expenses associated with FC franchise, *MABINOGI MOBILE* and MapleStory franchise, and an increase in R&D expenses attributable to increased headcount. Other expenses decreased year over year as the impairment loss of goodwill was recorded in the nine months ended September 30, 2024. Other income increased year over year due to a gain on liquidation of subsidiaries recorded in the nine months ended September 30, 2025. In addition, profit before tax and profit attributable to owners of parent decreased year over year as a result of a foreign exchange loss recorded in the nine months ended September 30, 2025.

As a result, for the nine months ended September 30, 2025, Nexon Group recorded revenue of \(\frac{\pmax}{351,503}\) million (down 4.1% year-over-year), operating profit of \(\frac{\pmax}{116,837}\) million (down 7.2% year-over-year), profit before tax of \(\frac{\pmax}{121,963}\) million (down 21.1% year-over-year) and profit attributable to owners of parent of \(\frac{\pmax}{81,195}\) million (down 21.0% year-over-year).

Business results by reportable segments for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 are as follows:

(a) Japan

Revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\),152 million (down 10.4% year-over-year), and segment loss amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\),599 million (segment loss of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1}\),892 million for the nine months ended September 30, 2024).

(b) Korea

Revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{319,525}\) million (down 6.2% year-over-year), and segment profit amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{120,726}\) million (down 16.4% year-over-year). Revenue in Korea includes royalty income of NEOPLE INC. (a subsidiary of NEXON Korea Corporation, our consolidated subsidiary) attributable to license agreements in China.

(c) China

(d) North America

Revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 amounted to \\ \xi21,636 million (up 61.6\% year-over-year), and segment profit amounted to \\ \xi1,666 million (segment loss of \\ \xi2,782 million for the nine months ended September 30, 2024).

(e) Other

Revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 amounted to \(\frac{\cup4}{4}\),855 million (down 11.3% year-over-year), and segment loss amounted to \(\frac{\cup4}{6}\),882 million (segment loss of \(\frac{\cup4}{6}\),522 million for the nine months ended September 30, 2024).

(2) Overview of Financial Position for the Period

(a) Assets, liabilities and equity

(Assets)

Total assets as of September 30, 2025 amounted to \(\pm\)1,300,125 million, an increase of \(\pm\)43,354 million from December 31, 2024. Major components include an increase of \(\pm\)194,642 million in cash and cash equivalents, a decrease of \(\pm\)84,124 million in other deposits, and a decrease of \(\pm\)40,522 million in other financial assets.

(Liabilities)

Total liabilities as of September 30, 2025 amounted to \(\frac{4}{2}38,348\) million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{1}2,102\) million from December 31, 2024. Major components include an increase of \(\frac{4}{1}5,010\) million in income taxes payable, an increase of \(\frac{4}{8},671\) million in other financial liabilities, an increase of \(\frac{4}{5},704\) million in trade and other payables, and a decrease of \(\frac{4}{1}7,700\) million in provisions.

(Equity)

Equity as of September 30, 2025 totaled \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{1}\),061,777 million, an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\),252 million from December 31, 2024. Major components of changes in equity include an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{8}}{8}\),195 million in retained earnings due to recording of profit attributable to owners of parent and a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{6}\),886 million in purchases of treasury shares.

As a result, ratio of equity attributable to owners of parent to total assets was 81.0% (81.1% as of December 31, 2024).

(b) Cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents (collectively, "cash") as of September 30, 2025 was \(\frac{1}{2}\)526,573 million, an increase of \(\frac{1}{2}\)194,642 million from December 31, 2024. The increase includes \(\frac{1}{2}\)(6,268) million in effects of a decrease due to exchange rate changes on cash.

Cash flows from each activity for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 and their significant components are as follows:

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities was \(\frac{\pmathb{1}}{23,021}\) million, compared to \(\frac{\pmathb{4}}{62,805}\) million for the nine months ended September 30, 2024. Major components of the increase include profit before tax of \(\frac{\pmathb{1}}{121,963}\) million and a decrease in trade and other receivables of \(\frac{\pmathb{3}}{31,380}\) million. Major components of the decrease include income taxes paid of \(\frac{\pmathb{3}}{36,337}\) million. Net cash provided by operating activities increased year over year due to a decrease in trade and other receivables.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash provided by investing activities was \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{4}}}172,765}{\text{ million}}\), compared to \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{\text{5}}},687}{\text{ million}}\) for the nine months ended September 30, 2024. Major cash inflows include proceeds from sales and redemption of securities of \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{\text{4}}}107,137}{\text{ million}}\) and a net decrease in time deposits of \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{\text{\text{4}}}85,987}}{\text{ million}}\). Major cash outflows include purchase of securities by investment funds under consolidated subsidiaries of \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{\text{0}}}}74}}{\text{\text{million}}}\) and purchase of investments accounted for using equity method of \(\frac{\pmath{\text{\text{10}},395}}{\text{million}}\). Net cash provided by investing activities increased year over year due to an increase in proceeds from sales of securities and decreases in time deposits.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities was \(\frac{4}{9}\)4,876 million, compared to \(\frac{4}{4}\)9,175 million for the nine months ended September 30, 2024. Major cash outflows include purchases of treasury shares of \(\frac{4}{9}\)6,886 million and dividends paid of \(\frac{4}{2}\)3,978 million. Net cash used in financing activities increased year over year due to increases in purchases of treasury shares and dividends paid.

(3) Explanation on Future Forecast Information including Consolidated Financial Results Forecast

In our consolidated business outlook, we disclose our expectations for the following quarter as a range to provide more accurate information to our shareholders and investors, since it is difficult to derive full-year consolidated forecasts due to uncertainties in projecting the speed of growth of PC online game and mobile game markets in which Nexon Group's main businesses operate, and because our revenue is largely dependent on such uncertain factors as users' preferences and whether or not we have any hit titles. "Consolidated Financial Results Forecast for the Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2025" is the sum of our actual consolidated financial results for the nine months ended September 30, 2025 and our consolidated business outlook for the three months ending December 31, 2025. Please refer to the table below for our consolidated financial results forecast for the three months ending December 31, 2025.

For the fiscal year ending December 31, 2025, Nexon Group expects consolidated revenue in the range of \$467,303 ~ 480,839 million (up 4.7% ~ 7.8% year-over-year), operating profit in the range of \$138,581 ~ 148,711 million (up 11.6% ~ 19.8% year-over-year), profit before tax in the range of \$147,865 ~ 157,995 million (down 24.6% ~ 19.4% year-over-year), profit in the range of \$101,327 ~ 109,702 million (down 25.6% ~ 19.5% year-over-year), profit attributable to owners of parent in the range of \$103,427 ~ 111,802 million (down 23.3% ~ 17.1% year-over-year), and basic earnings per share in the range of \$128.58 ~ 139.00. Nexon Group operates its businesses around the world, in Japan, South Korea, China, the United States and other countries. Major exchange rates for Q4 2025 are assumed to be 1 U.S Dollar = \$151.30, 100 South Korean Won = \$10.66 and 1 Chinese Yuan = \$21.40. In general, the exchange rates of the South Korean Won and the Chinese Yuan to Japanese Yen are assumed to be linked to the exchange rate of U.S. Dollar to Japanese Yen. Based on this assumption, we expect that every one Japanese Yen move against the U.S. Dollar will have an impact of approximately \$800 million on consolidated revenue and approximately \$155 million on operating profit for the three months ending December 31, 2025.

In the three months ending December 31, 2025, we anticipate double-digit revenue growth year over year in MapleStory and FC franchises and *Dungeon&Fighter* (PC). We also expect to benefit from *MABINOGI MOBILE*, which launched in March, and new titles launching in Q4, including *ARC Raiders* and *MapleStory: Idle RPG*. As a result, we expect overall revenue to grow year over year in the three months ending December 31, 2025. Outlook by key franchise is as follows.

Dungeon&Fighter franchise revenue is expected to decline year over year. For *Dungeon&Fighter* (PC), we anticipate continued year-over-year growth both in China and Korea. For *Dungeon&Fighter Mobile*, we expect revenue to be roughly flat quarter over quarter despite a typical weak seasonality.

MapleStory franchise revenue is expected to grow year over year. We expect Korea MapleStory to support its

strong player engagement with the release of the winter update and its revenue to increase year over year. However, we anticipate a modest year-over-year revenue decline in regions outside Korea. For *MapleStory Worlds*, we expect revenue to increase year over year. In addition, we expect to benefit from *MapleStory: Idle RPG* launched on November 6.

For FC franchise, we anticipate year-over-year growth to continue in the three months ending December 31, 2025

As for other major titles, while we anticipate a sequential moderation in *MABINOGI MOBILE* revenue, we plan to sustain players through exciting collaborations and new content updates. We expect a significant contribution from *ARC Raiders*, which has been off to a strong start since its launch on October 30.

On the cost side in Q4, we anticipate a year-over-year increase in royalty expenses due to contributions from *MABINOGI MOBILE* and *MapleStory: Idle RPG* and growth in FC franchise. We also expect increased platform fees due to increases in revenues from Steam and mobile platforms. In addition, we anticipate increased marketing costs compared to last year due to promotions for new titles such as *MABINOGI MOBILE*, *ARC Raiders* and *MapleStory: Idle RPG*, increased HR costs due to a headcount increase, and increased fees to creators tied to revenue growth in *MapleStory Worlds*.

On the other hand, in Q4, we expect another gain of approximately ¥5 billion associated with the liquidation of our subsidiary funds.

Our business outlook is based on information currently available to us, which includes various uncertainties. Therefore, actual performance may vary from our outlook due to changes in the business condition.

(Significant Matters Forming the Basis for Preparing Condensed Quarterly Consolidated Financial Statements)

The condensed quarterly consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Article 5, Paragraph 2 of the Standards for the Preparation of Quarterly Financial Statements, etc. of the Tokyo Stock Exchange, Inc. However, some disclosures in IAS 34 *Interim Financial Reporting* have been omitted in accordance with Article 5, Paragraph 5 of the Standards for the Preparation of Quarterly Financial Statements, etc.

(Notes on Segment Information)

(a) Outline of reportable segments

Reportable segments of Nexon Group are components of Nexon Group, for which separate financial statements are available, that are evaluated regularly by the Board of Directors in deciding how to allocate management resources and in assessing performance.

Nexon Group is engaged in production, development and distribution of PC online games and mobile games, and the Company (in Japan) and its local consolidated subsidiaries (overseas) develop overall strategies and operate business activities for their respective products and services in each region as independent units. Accordingly, Nexon Group is comprised of geographical business segments based on production, development, and distribution of PC online games and mobile games. Nexon Group has formed its reportable segments by consolidating business segments based on the geographic location since subsidiaries in the same region, due to their business characteristics, receive similar impact of the foreign exchange fluctuation risk on their operating results and the ratio of the impact to operating results is high. There are five reportable segments: "Japan", "Korea", "China", "North America" and "Other" which includes Europe and Asian countries.

Furthermore, IFRS 15 *Revenue from Contracts with Customers* is applied by Nexon Group. We have therefore presented the revenue arising from our contracts with customers by breaking it down into PC online, mobile and other revenues based on such contracts with customers.
