#### 2. Details of Business

During the current interim consolidated accounting period, there were no significant changes in the details of the businesses operated by the Group (the Company and its affiliated companies).

There were no changes in major subsidiaries and affiliates.

Furthermore, on October 1, 2025, we executed an absorption-type merger in which the Company was the surviving entity and the consolidated subsidiary, OPTIM Digital Construction Co., Ltd., was the absorbed (non-surviving) entity. Details are provided in "4. Financial Information, 1. Notes to Consolidated Interim Financial Statements (Subsequent Events)." In addition, a resolution was passed to dissolve our affiliate, DXGoGo Co., Ltd., and the liquidation process is currently underway.

#### 2. Status of Business

### 1. Business and Other Risks

During the current interim consolidated accounting period, there were no new risks associated with the business, etc., or significant changes in the risks associated with the business, etc., described in the Annual Securities Report for the previous fiscal year.

#### 2. Management's Analysis of Financial Position, Operating Results and Status of Cash Flows

The forward-looking statements in this document are based on judgments made as of the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period.

#### (1) Status of financial condition and results of operations

#### (i) Results of operations

Under the vision of "Creating the Future of Every Industry with AI," our Group is accelerating strategic investments aimed at achieving future exponential growth.

During the current interim consolidated accounting period, the Group accelerated the deployment of its AI-centric X-Tech services (AI/IoT services). Leveraging its proprietary AI/IoT common platform, "OPTiM Cloud IoT OS," the Group launched new services and added features across diverse fields including agriculture, construction, healthcare, office environments, and infrastructure inspection. It is driving solutions to on-site challenges and operational efficiency improvements through AI-powered image analysis and automation technologies.

New business initiatives also commenced within our stable growth revenue base, the Mobile Management Service. Starting with integration with the AI agent-type chatbot "OPTiM AIRES," we announced the integrated service "OPTiM Biz Premium," designed to solve challenges across all IT operations (\*1). Through the evolution of "OPTiM Biz," we will address a wide variety of challenges.

Furthermore, we introduced the "AI Coding Assistant" (\*2) for all engineers, strengthening our AI development capabilities. We will continue to promote AI utilization within the company, aiming to enhance creativity and productivity.

Below, we will report on the specific progress made during the current interim consolidated accounting period, categorized under "X-Tech Services (AI/IoT Services)" and "Mobile Management Services."

#### Expanding "X-Tech Services (AI/IoT Services)" to Drive Future Leapfrog Growth

In our "X-Tech Services (AI/IoT Services)" that solve challenges in existing industries using cutting-edge technology, we are rapidly expanding our business foundation by continuously creating innovation across various fields through the utilization of our proprietary AI/IoT common platform, "OPTiM Cloud IoT OS".

#### ● AgriTech (Agricultural DX (\*3)):

The shift from helicopter spraying to drone spraying is accelerating. New pest control needs are surging due to climate change. The "Pinpoint Timed Spraying Service" is expanding through strengthened collaboration with Zen-Noh, JA, and others.

Our flagship service, the domestic market-leading (\*4) drone spraying DX service "Pinpoint Timed Spraying Service," entered its peak season. Compared to last fiscal year, the number of customers, fields (\*5), and field area increased, significantly contributing to sales. Furthermore, recent climate change, particularly the impact of warm winters and intense heatwaves, has led to increased pest and disease outbreaks. This has expanded service demand even in areas that previously did not require pest control.

# Digital Construction (Construction/Civil Engineering DX):

Achieving millimeter-level precision surveying enables support for construction types requiring high surveying accuracy, such as paving work (\*6) and structural work (\*7), expanding the market.

O For the smartphone 3D surveying app "OPTiM Geo Scan," we launched "Geo Scan Supreme," the world's first smartphone surveying app (\*8) to enable millimeter-level data acquisition compliant with the Ministry of Land,

Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism's guidelines for pavement construction (\*9). This enables support not only for earthwork (\*10) and similar tasks, but also for construction types requiring high surveying accuracy like pavement construction and structural work, expanding the millimeter-level market.

#### • Digital Health (Medical DX):

#### Smooth rollout of "OPTiM AI Hospital," a hospital-focused service featuring generative AI

Added features such as "Voice Recorder AI Summary" and "Attending Physician Opinion Letter Creation." Implementation was decided at Uchida Hospital, operated by the 100-bed medical corporation Daiseikai, marking its first adoption by a chronic care hospital (\*11). Negotiations and PoCs (\*12) are also progressing smoothly with multiple other medical institutions.

#### Office DX:

### Accelerating the deployment of AI services utilizing generative AI

#### · AI Agent-type Chatbot "OPTiM AIRES":

Online user registration is now available, enabling deployment in as little as 5 minutes. A free trial plan has also been introduced, making implementation more accessible. This has led to adoption by major corporations and local governments.

#### ○ Cloud AI Document Management Service "OPTiM Document Management":

"OPTiM Document Management," which significantly reduces document management risks and costs using AI, has launched a table field extraction feature, further strengthening its market advantage.

#### ○ AI Internal Portal Site "OPTiM Collaboration Portal" (New Service):

It was discovered that many "OPTiM Biz" users lack well-organized internal operational manuals or face challenges in updating and managing them. To address these issues with AI, we have launched "OPTiM Collaboration Portal."

"OPTiM Collaboration Portal" provides 22 representative templates for creating internal operational manuals. By simply interacting with AI based on these templates, operational manuals are automatically generated, enabling easy construction of an internal portal site. Furthermore, the entire portal site can be reorganized and updated cross-functionally just by instructing the AI, significantly reducing maintenance work for administrators. The templates will be expanded sequentially.

# ● Infrastructure Inspection DX: The New Standard - Inspect with Your Smartphone, Generate Reports with AI

#### O Proximity Visual Inspection Support Service "Civil ReSnap" (New Service):

We have expanded our infrastructure inspection service lineup to meet evolving needs. By using a smartphone app to tag and photograph inspection records, AI automates report generation. This streamlines the entire process from field documentation to report creation in infrastructure inspection work.

#### New Developments for Japan's No. 1 Mobile Management Service

"OPTiM Biz," which centrally manages corporate smartphones and PCs to ensure security, has steadily increased its license count alongside market growth, supporting a stable revenue base. We have now expanded our service lineup and launched new business initiatives.

#### Launch of "OPTiM Biz Premium," an integrated service that streamlines and automates all IT operations

We have launched "OPTiM Biz Premium," Japan's first service (\*13) to streamline and automate the increasingly broad and complex IT operations tasks faced by companies, priced at ¥980 per ID per month.
 Based on our existing "OPTiM Biz" platform, which specializes in traditional smartphone and PC management

(MDM(\*14)), this service integrates the various IT operations support services(\*15) we have provided to date. Building on the strengths cultivated through MDM, we serve as an integrated partner guiding solutions for all IT department challenges, supporting the entirety of corporate IT operations.

# • "OPTIM AIRES" integrated into "OPTIM Biz". Automates internal IT support with AI, reducing the burden on IT staff

O We have launched "OPTiM Biz" with the AI chat agent "OPTiM AIRES" for IT support as a standard feature. This

enables automatic AI responses to resolve employee inquiries—a particularly burdensome task for IT departments—thereby improving employee efficiency and reducing the workload on IT teams. By adding such features, we are enhancing the user experience and solidifying the stable growth of "OPTiM Biz".

#### ● 15 Consecutive Years as Japan's No. 1 Market Share Leader (\*16)

We achieved the No. 1 domestic market share for the 15th consecutive year in the research report "Market Outlook for Collaboration and Mobile Management Software 2025 Edition" published by Deloitte Tohmatsu Mic Research Institute Co., Ltd. We received evaluations across 20 sectors, including markets for schools, public utilities, finance, distribution, services, telecommunications, and manufacturing.

Finally, we would like to share our initiatives as part of our strategic investment activities in the AI field.

# Accelerating the Shift to a Fully AI-Utilizing Development Organization—Promoting Productivity Enhancement and a Shift to Creative Work

We implemented an "AI Coding Assistant" for all engineers company-wide to enhance operational efficiency and development capabilities through AI technology. This significantly boosted engineer productivity and accelerated the shift toward creative tasks. Furthermore, to foster an internal culture of generative AI utilization, we hosted events featuring external AI engineers, thereby elevating our overall development capabilities.

As a result of these initiatives, the operating results for the current interim consolidated accounting period were as follows: net sales amounted to 4,971,020 thousand yen (up 10.0% from the previous interim period), operating income was 914,513 thousand yen (up 15.2% from the previous interim period), ordinary income of 857,171 thousand yen (up 29.2% from the previous interim period), and interim net income attributable to owners of parent of 538,843 thousand yen (up 40.5% from the previous interim period).

Both cultivated field area and customer numbers continue to increase. As a leading company in DX and AX (AI Transformation (\*17)) across industries, OPTIM will continue to solve societal challenges and achieve sustainable growth.

#### (ii) Analysis of financial position

(Assets)

The balance of assets at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period was 12,796,097 thousand yen, an increase of 1,702,024 thousand yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This is mainly due to increases of 1,589,123 thousand yen in cash and deposits, and 1,687,066 thousand yen in Inventories, while notes and accounts receivable-trade and contract assets decreased by 1,681,311 thousand yen.

(Liabilities)

The balance of total liabilities at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting year was 3,777,716 thousand yen, an increase of 1,202,929 thousand yen from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This is mainly due to an increase of 1,500,000 thousand yen in Short-term borrowings.

(Net assets)

The balance of net assets at the end of current interim accounting period was 9,018,380 thousand yen, an increase of 499,094 thousand yen compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year. This is mainly due to an increase of 538,843 thousand yen in retained earnings due to profit attributable to owners of parent.

#### (2) Analysis of Cash Flow Status

Cash and cash equivalents (hereafter, "cash") at the end of the current interim consolidated accounting period increased by 1,589,123 thousand yen compared to the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year, to 3,323,918 thousand yen.

The status of each cash flow and their factors during the current interim consolidated accounting period are as follows.

#### (Net cash provided by (used in) operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities amounted to 878,146 thousand yen (1,773,394 thousand yen was acquired in the previous interim consolidated accounting period). This was mainly due to the following: profit before income taxes of 857,171 thousand yen; depreciation and amortization expenses of 651,916 thousand yen; and a decrease in accounts receivable of 1,681,311 thousand yen, while there was an increase in inventories amounted to 1,687,066 thousand yen and also there was a payment of corporate taxes of 311,549 thousand yen.

#### (Net cash provided by (used in) investing activities)

Net cash used in investment activities amounted to 789,022 thousand yen (compared to 869,168 thousand yen used in the previous interim consolidated accounting period). This was mainly due to the 782,896 thousand yen spent on purchase of intangible assets.

#### (Net cash provided by (used in) financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities amounted to 1,500,000 thousand yen (298,371 thousand yen used in the previous interim consolidated accounting period). This was mainly due to the expenditure of 1,500,000 thousand yen for proceeds from short-term borrowings.

#### (3) Management policy and strategy, etc.

During the current interim consolidated accounting period, there were no significant changes to the management policies and strategies, etc., determined by the Group.

#### (4) Factual and financial issues to be addressed

During the current interim consolidated accounting period, there were no significant changes to the issues that the Group must address.

#### (5) Research and development activities

The total amount of our Group's research and development expenses for the current interim consolidated accounting period was 411,359 thousand yen. Note that research and development expenses under selling, general and administrative expenses totaled 386,127 thousand yen. This was due to the fact that contract income related to research and development was treated as a deduction from selling, general and administrative expenses.

There were no significant changes in the status of the Group's research and development activities during the current interim consolidated accounting period.

#### (6) Factors that may have a significant impact on operating results

There were no significant changes in the major factors affecting the Group's operation results during the current interim consolidated accounting period.

At a meeting of the Board of Directors held on July 24, 2025, the Company resolved to conduct an absorption-type merger in which the Company will be the surviving entity and the consolidated subsidiary, OPTIM Digital Construction Co., Ltd., will be the absorbed (non-surviving) entity. The absorption-type merger agreement was signed on July 25, 2025. Furthermore, based on this agreement, the merger was executed on October 1, 2025.
