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1. Qualitative Information about the Interim Financial Results

(1) Explanation about Operating Results

During the Current Consolidated Interim Accounting Period (April 1, 2025 to September 30, 2025), Japan's economy maintained a moderate recovery trend, driven by improved employment and income conditions that supported a recovery in personal consumption, as well as increased inbound demand. However, the outlook remains uncertain due to rising prices, volatility in raw material costs, and increasing difficulty in forecasting overseas economic trends.

In the information services industry, investment in digital transformation (hereinafter "DX") aimed at strengthening corporate competitiveness continued to perform solidly. Demand has expanded across a broad range of areas, particularly in cloud service adoption, operational efficiency improvements using generative AI, and system upgrades to enhance productivity.

Amid this environment, our Group has formulated the medium-term management plan "Be a Visionary System Integrator" covering the period from April 2025 to March 2028. As customer issues grow increasingly complex and diverse due to further changes in social conditions and technological trends, with demands for essential and high-value contributions intensifying, this medium-term management plan establishes a vision to be an unparalleled partner for our customers by enhancing TDC's foresight for the future and delivering exceptional development technologies and services while pursuing long-term growth. To make this vision a reality, we have two Group-wide core strategies.

The first strategy, "diversification and enhancement of expertise and knowledge," aims to enhance our capacity to address increasingly complex customer issues by possessing a broader range of highly specialized fields. The second strategy, "enhancement of our ability to create proposals that deliver value for customers," aims to enhance our capability to create proposals that maximize customer value through effective IT utilization, based on a deep understanding of both the characteristics of elemental technologies and our customers' situations and strategies.

During this interim consolidated accounting period, each business field performed well and proceeds exceeded the plan, achieving an increase in revenue. On the profit side, we encountered unexpected man-hour cost overruns in certain projects where we took on new business areas with high technical complexity, resulting in some unprofitable projects. However, overall profit increased due to higher revenue.

SG&A expenses increased due to continued aggressive investments for future business expansion. However, these costs were absorbed by the effects of increased revenue, resulting in higher operating profit. With regard to specific investment initiatives, we are implementing a variety of human capital investments, such as expanding recruitment efforts, including mid-career professionals, and strengthening educational initiatives, including career development. Additionally, as business investments, we are promoting the acquisition of new technologies aimed at expanding our high-value-added business and marketing activities to expand sales of proprietary products.

Additionally, extraordinary profit has been recorded due to the sale of shares in NTT DATA Group Corporation following the reorganization of the NTT Group.

As a result, for the current interim consolidated accounting period, proceeds amounted to \$23,343 million (up 9.3% YOY), operating profit was \$2,647 million (up 10.2% YOY), ordinary profit was \$2,756 million (up 12.9% YOY), and interim profit attributable to owners of parent was \$1,984 million (up 20.1% YOY).

Status of activities by field

<IT consulting and services>

In the IT consulting and services field, we offer services that include developing IT strategies and systemization planning to facilitate customers' DX and providing technical consulting and educational services about the latest technologies and development methodologies. We also provide our internally developed cloud application services, along with solution services, such as BI (Note 1)/DWH (Note 2) and ERP (Note 3)/CRM (Note 4). During this quarter, the Group made solid progress on SaaS (Note 5) solution service projects related to IT service management and cloud managed services for financial institutions and the manufacturing industry. As a result, proceeds in this field increased 18.3% year on year to ¥4,140 million.

<IT solutions for financial services>

In the field of IT solutions for financial services, we offer integrated IT solutions for the financial sector, including systemization planning, design, development, and maintenance. During this quarter, the Group made solid progress on development projects for bank- and insurance-related systems. As a result, proceeds in this field increased 3.0% year on year to ¥9,814 million.

<IT solutions for public corporations>

In the field of IT solutions for public corporations, we offer integrated IT solutions for the logistics, manufacturing, and service industries as well as the public sector, including systemization planning, design, development, and maintenance. During this fiscal year, the Group made solid progress on development projects for the steel sector and public agencies. As a result, proceeds in this field increased 10.6% year on year to \(\frac{1}{2}\)6,384 million.

<Platform solutions>

In the field of platform solutions, we offer services such as the environmental design and construction of IT infrastructure, along with operational support, network product development, and network integration. During this quarter, the Group made solid progress on projects to build cloud-related infrastructure for businesses in the bank, insurance, and transportation sectors. As a result, proceeds in this field increased 17.8% year on year to $\frac{1}{2}3,004$ million.

(2) Explanation about Financial Status

State of assets, liabilities, and net assets

Total assets at the end of this interim consolidated accounting period increased by ¥329 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to ¥28,615 million.

Current assets decreased by \(\xi\)1,142 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \(\xi\)22,105 million. This is mainly due to a decrease of \(\xi\)3,716 million in cash and deposits despite increases of \(\xi\)2,198 million in securities, \(\xi\)203 million in work in process, and \(\xi\)202 million in notes and accounts receivable trade, and contract assets.

Non-current assets increased by \$1,471 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \$6,510 million. This is mainly due to an increase of \$1,574 million in investment securities.

Current liabilities decreased by ¥636 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to ¥6,233 million. This is mainly due to decreases of ¥406 million in accounts payable - other, ¥329 million in accrued expenses, and ¥186 million in short-term borrowings, despite increases of ¥180 million in income taxes payable and ¥142 million in advances received included in Other.

Non-current liabilities decreased by ¥88 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to ¥446 million. This is mainly due to decreases of ¥36 million in provision for share-based remuneration for directors (and other officers) and ¥31 million in long-term accrued expenses included in Other.

Net assets increased by ¥1,054 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to ¥21,935 million. This is mainly due to increases of ¥693 million in retained earnings and ¥306 million in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities.

Cash flow conditions

The balance of cash and cash equivalents at the end of this interim consolidated accounting period decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{\pmathbf{2}}}{2}\),616 million from the end of the previous consolidated fiscal year to \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{12}\),633 million (\(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{13}\),410 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year). Cash flow conditions during this interim consolidated accounting period and their factors are as stated below:

(Cash flows from operating activities)

While income taxes paid were \pm 759 million, a decrease in accounts payable - other was \pm 406 million, and a decrease in accrued expenses was \pm 360 million, interim profit before income taxes was \pm 2,922 million, among other factors, and cash flows from operating activities amounted to \pm 874 million (\pm 1,035 million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

(Cash flows from investing activities)

While proceeds from sales of investment securities were \(\frac{1}{2}\)200 million, purchase of investment securities was \(\frac{1}{2}1,203\) million and purchase of securities was \(\frac{1}{2}1,098\) million. As a result, cash flows from investing activities amounted to negative \(\frac{1}{2}2,005\) million (\(\frac{1}{2}5\) million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Dividends paid totaled $\pm 1,292$ million, and there was a net decrease in short-term borrowings of ± 186 million. As a result, cash flows from financing activities amounted to negative $\pm 1,485$ million (negative $\pm 1,009$ million in the same period of the previous fiscal year).
