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1. Overview of Operating Results, etc.

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025, the Miura Group finalized the tentative accounting treatment for business combinations, which has accordingly been applied to figures related to the six months ended September 30, 2024.

(1) Overview of Operating Results

Looking back on the state of the Japanese economy during the six months ended September 30, 2025, although the economy has continued to be on the path of gradual recovery, the outlook remains uncertain mainly due to rising prices, geopolitical issues, and changes in trade policy.

Under these circumstances, in Japan, the Miura Group has been deepening its total solutions through the expansion of its product lineup and providing plant-wide maintenance services (remote support, maintenance for non-MIURA equipment, etc.) to strengthen trust with customers. Overseas, the Miura Group has been advancing its business as a provider of heat-energy solution in accordance with its presence in each country's and region's market.

Regarding the consolidated financial results for the six months ended September 30, 2025, in Japan, boiler and related equipment, marine equipment, and maintenance business were solid. Overseas, sales increased due to the impact of the performance reflection period of The Cleaver-Brooks Company, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Cleaver-Brooks, Inc.") and CERTUSS GmbH (hereinafter referred to as "CERTUSS").

In terms of profits, profits increased due to the impact of increased sales, and a decrease in M&A expenses, despite an increase in personnel expenses.

As a result, revenue was \$123,926 million, up 11.3% from the same period of the previous fiscal year, operating profit was \$13,942 million, up 53.5%, profit before income taxes amounted to \$16,681 million, up 62.9% and profit attributable to owners of parent stood at \$12,242 million, up 66.1%.

Operating results for each business segment are as follows.

Furthermore, the segment classification has been changed from the first quarter ended June 30, 2025.

(i) Japan

In the Japan business, sales increased due to solid sales of boiler and related equipment, and marine equipment. In addition, sales increased due to an increase in the number of paid maintenance contracts for boilers and the promotion of energy-saving activities.

As a result, revenue in this business was \(\xxi{61,966}\) million, up 8.0% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\(\xxi{57,369}\) million). Segment profit was \(\xxi{9,280}\) million, up 10.5% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\(\xxi{8,396}\) million), due to the impact of increased sales, despite increases such as personnel expenses.

(ii) Americas

In the Americas business, sales increased due to the impact of the performance reflection period (4.5 months in the previous fiscal year) of Cleaver-Brooks, Inc.

As a result, revenue in this business was \(\frac{\pmathbb{4}}{43,334}\) million, up 15.4% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\(\frac{\pmathbb{2}}{37,549}\) million). Segment profit was \(\frac{\pmathbb{5}}{5,076}\) million, up 1.9% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\(\frac{\pmathbb{4}}{4,981}\) million), due to the impact of increased sales, despite increases such as personnel expenses.

(iii) Asia and Others

In the Asia and Others business, sales increased due to the impact of the performance reflection period (5 months in the previous fiscal year) of CERTUSS and solid sales of boilers in each country and region.

As a result, revenue in this business was \\pm\$18,625 million, up 13.2% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\\pm\$16,455 million). Segment profit was \\\pm\$1,882 million, up 20.6% from the same period of the previous fiscal year (\\\pm\$1,560 million).

Total assets as of September 30, 2025, were \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{438,141}\) million, a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1,002}\) million compared to the previous fiscal year-end. Current assets increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{2,013}\) million, mainly due to increases in inventories by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,944}\) million and other financial assets by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,016}\) million, while trade and other receivables decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4,584}\) million. Non-current assets decreased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,016}\) million, mainly due to decreases in goodwill and intangible assets by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,454}\) million, and deferred tax assets by \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1,439}\) million, while investments accounted for using the equity method increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2,084}\) million.

Total liabilities were \$220,833 million, a decrease of \$13,019 million compared to the previous fiscal year-end. Current liabilities decreased by \$2,904 million, mainly due to decreases in trade and other payables by \$2,227 million, and other current liabilities by \$1,500 million, while income taxes payable increased by \$392 million and contract liabilities by \$392 million. Non-current liabilities decreased by \$10,114 million, mainly due to decreases in other financial liabilities by \$392 million and deferred tax liabilities by \$1,224 million.

Total equity was \$217,308 million, a increase of \$12,016 million compared to the previous fiscal year-end. This was mainly due to increases in retained earnings by \$8,658 million and other components of equity by \$3,601 million. As a result, the ratio of equity attributable to owners of parent to total assets comes to 49.3%.

(ii) Cash Flows for the Period under Review

The following outlines the state of cash flows by category during the six months ended September 30, 2025, under review.

Net cash provided by operating activities totaled \$18,442 million (\$8,475 million provided in the same period of the previous year). The increase was mainly due to profit before income taxes of \$16,681 million, as well as depreciation and amortization of \$6,809 million. The decrease was mainly due to an increase in income taxes paid of \$4,453 million.

Net cash used in investing activities totaled \(\xi\)3,691 million (\(\xi\)120,118 million used in the same period of the previous year). This was mainly due to proceeds from withdrawal of time deposits of \(\xi\)5,991 million and payments into time deposits of \(\xi\)8,194 million.

Net cash used in financing activities totaled \$14,708 million (\$121,399 million provided in the same period of the previous year). This was mainly due to repayments of long-term borrowings of \$8,545 million and dividends paid of \$4,275 million.

As a result of the above, cash and cash equivalents as of September 30, 2025, were \\$55,803 million, an increase of \\$551 million compared to the previous fiscal year-end.

(3) Explanation of Consolidated Forecasts and Other Forward-Looking Statements

Since the potential impacts of U.S. tariff policies and other factors on the performance of the Miura Group are expected to be minimal due to measures such as revisions to selling prices and cost reductions, the full-year consolidated forecasts for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, announced on May 14, 2025, remain unchanged. Furthermore, if it is determined that a revision to the forecasts is necessary, the Company will promptly disclose any changes.

3. Notes on Condensed Consolidated Financial Statements

(Notes on Going Concern Assumptions)

None

(Material Accounting Policies)

Material accounting policies adopted in the condensed consolidated financial statements for the six months ended September 30, 2025, basically remain the same as those adopted in the consolidated financial statements for the previous fiscal year.

In addition, income tax expenses for the six months ended September 30, 2025, are calculated based upon an estimated annual effective tax rate.

(Segment Information)

(1) General Information on Reporting Segments

Financial information which is broken down within each component unit is available for the Miura Group's reporting segments. The information is subject to regular review by the Board of Directors in order to make decisions about resources to be allocated and to assess performance.

The Miura Group is engaged primarily in the manufacture, sales, and maintenance of boilers and related equipment. The Company and domestic affiliated companies undertake our domestic business, and our overseas affiliated companies undertake our overseas business. Each of our local subsidiaries is an independent management unit that proposes comprehensive strategy for the products it handles in each region and engages in business activities.

Accordingly, the Miura Group is composed of three regional segments, which are Japan, Americas, and Asia and Others, as our reporting segments.

Furthermore, regarding profit of the reporting segments, the Miura Group has deducted "Amortization, etc. of intangible assets recognized through acquisitions," which include the amortization of intangible assets and the fair value adjustment to inventories recognized by the allocation of the acquisition cost, and "Expenses related to M&A," which include expenses such as financial advisory fees, from operating profit in order to better clarify the contribution of the acquired company to the overall earnings of the Group.

(2) Changes in Reporting Segments

The Miura Group had four reporting segments until the previous fiscal year, which were Domestic Manufacturing and Sales of Products, Domestic Maintenance, Overseas Manufacturing and Sales of Products, and Overseas Maintenance.

In the current management environment, the actual management unit of the Company, domestic affiliated companies and overseas affiliated companies are mutually complementary, with Manufacturing and Sales of Products as well as Maintenance functioning as a single entity. Therefore, the Miura Group has determined that evaluating performance by region would lead to a more appropriate assessment, and has revised the reporting segments accordingly. As a result, the Miura Group has adopted three regional segments, which are Japan, Americas, and Asia and Others, as our reporting segments effective from the first quarter ended June 30, 2025.

In addition, the segment information for the six months ended September 30, 2024, has been prepared based on the classification after the change.

In the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025, the Miura Group finalized the tentative accounting treatment for business combinations, which has accordingly been applied to figures related to the six months ended September 30, 2024.

(2) Segment revenue and performance
