Notice Concerning Revision of Consolidated Forecast and Recognition of
Extraordinary Loss (Impairment Loss on Fixed Assets)

Asante, Inc. (the "Company") announces that it has revised its full-year consolidated business forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026 (April 1, 2025 to March 31, 2026), which was announced on May 9, 2025, as follows. In addition, the Company expects to record an extraordinary loss (impairment loss on fixed assets).

1. Revision of forecast for full-year consolidated financial results for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026 (April 1, 2025 - March 31, 2026)

The dividend forecast remains unchanged.

2. Reasons for the Revision of the Full-Year Consolidated Business Forecast

Regarding the full-year consolidated business forecast for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, the Company has made efforts to increase net sales through proactive advertising and promotional activities, greater investment in human capital, and the introduction of systems aimed at improving sales efficiency. However, results did not reach the level commensurate with these initiatives and investments due to unstable weather and temperatures that affected termite activity, as well as a slower-than-expected recovery in consumer sentiment.

As a result of the decline in net sales, each profit item is expected to fall below the previous forecast. In addition, net income attributable to owners of the parent is expected to fall further below the previous forecast, partly due to the impact of the extraordinary loss described below.

In light of these circumstances, the Company has revised its full-year consolidated business forecast.

3. Recognition of Extraordinary Loss (Impairment Loss on Fixed Assets)

The Company has been working to enhance and streamline its human resource training system, including the expansion of online training programs and the strengthening of its OJT framework. As these initiatives have produced a certain level of results, the Company has decided to consolidate its training center functions into the Mikkabi General Training Center (Hamamatsu City, Shizuoka Prefecture).

Accordingly, the operation of the Inawashiro General Training Center (Yama District, Fukushima Prefecture) will be suspended. As a result, in the fourth quarter of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, the Company expects to recognize an impairment loss on fixed assets of ¥280 million as an extraordinary loss, based on the “Accounting Standard for Impairment of Fixed Assets,” after writing down the asset as an idle asset with no expected future use.
