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1. Overview of Operating Results

(1) Overview of Operating Results for the current fiscal year

During the consolidated fiscal year, the global economy confronted growing economic uncertainty and an increased risk of an economic downturn due to the unpredictable direction of U.S. trade policy and a rise in geopolitical risks, particularly in the Middle East. However, the global economy appears to have maintained a more stable growth than expected, which is supported by factors such as the front-loading of production and trade by companies in preparation for additional U.S. tariffs, robust investment in artificial intelligence (AI) in the United States, and fiscal expansion in various countries.

Amid this economic environment, both the powder-related business and the blown film-related business saw a decrease in orders received compared to the previous consolidated fiscal year, as the investment decision-making for large-scale projects continued to be postponed in the markets related to our company, given the future uncertainty arising from concerns over U.S. trade policy and the lack of improvement in the German manufacturing recession. Due to the decrease in the order backlog carried over from the beginning of the period and the reduced orders received during the period, net sales also decreased. While we made efforts to reduce expenses in light of this situation, the impact of the decline in net sales was significant, resulting in a decrease in operating income. Moreover, the recording of extraordinary losses, such as business structure improvement expenses overseas, resulted in a decrease in profit attributable to owners of the parent.

(Powder related business)

This business is a core business of the Hosokawa Micron Group, which manufactures and sells grinding and classifying equipment, mixing and drying equipment for the global market, air pollution control equipment, dust collectors for product collection, and precision air conditioning control equipment for the Japanese market, and provides toll processing services for fine powders. It also includes the development and commercialization of new materials, mainly composite nanoparticles for the Japanese market.

The Group's company-wide efforts in the aftermarket business remained stable and showed an expansion trend throughout each quarter. Although the chemicals and electronic materials sectors regarding the machinery and equipment also saw higher orders received than the previous fiscal year due to large projects secured at the beginning of the period, other markets generally remained sluggish. While we endeavored to secure small- and medium-sized projects with short delivery times, revenue decreased due to lower order backlog carried over from the beginning of the period.

Regarding U.S. trade policy, the U.S. toll processing business was marginally affected, as some customers rely on imports from outside the U.S. for their raw materials. This led to a price surge in imported raw materials, prompting some customers to postpone placing orders for processing work with us. However, the impact was insignificant.

As the result of this, orders received are \(\frac{1}{2}\) 56,209 million (2.2% decrease versus the previous same period), backlog of orders is \(\frac{1}{2}\) 34,429 million (0.3% decrease versus the previous same period), and net sales are \(\frac{1}{2}\) 58,617 million (9.8% decrease versus the previous same period). Profit for the segment is \(\frac{1}{2}\) 6,456 million (13.5% decrease versus the previous same period).

(Blown film-related business)

This business develops, manufactures, and sells various types of high-performance blown film equipment from single to multiple layers. While orders received for Europe, one of our key markets, remained at the same level as the previous fiscal year, orders received for the United States, another key market, saw delays in finalizing contracts due to the impact of U.S. trade policy, despite robust inquiries. Although there were increases in orders for the Asian and South American markets, they were insufficient to fully compensate for the decrease in U.S. orders. Consequently, the total amount of orders received reflected a reactionary decline from the previous fiscal year, which recorded the second-highest level of orders received ever. Net sales also decreased due to the reduction in orders.

Regarding U.S. trade policy, our blown film-related business involves exporting major equipment such as extruders and winders, which are produced in Germany, to our U.S. sales subsidiary. The subsidiary then procures ancillary equipment such as control panels within the U.S. for sale to the end customer. Currently, tariffs appear to be influencing customers' decisions regarding capital investment, and we anticipate some volatility in the short term. However, we judge the situation to be stable over the medium to long terrm. As the result of this, orders received are ¥ 18,250 million (9.9% decrease versus the previous same period), backlog of orders is ¥9,776 million (4.1% decrease versus the previous same period). Profit for the segment is ¥2,122 million (14.4% decrease versus the previous same period)

(2) Overview of Financial Positions

Total assets at September 30, 2025, amounted to \(\pm\)102,734 million, an increase of \(\pm\)4,662 million compared to the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024. This was primarily attributable to increases in property, plant and equipment, an increase of \(\pm\)2,010 million. Total liabilities were \(\pm\) 35,514 million, a decrease of \(\pm\)932 million compared to the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024. This was primarily attributable to decreases in notes and accounts payable-trade, a decrease of \(\pm\)1,537 million.

Net assets were ¥67,219 million, an increase of ¥5,595 million compared to the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024. This was primarily attributable to increases in foreign currency translation adjustment, an increase of ¥3,628 million.

(3) Overview of Cash Flow

The balance of cash and cash equivalents increased ¥4,088 million from the fiscal year ended September 30, 2024 to a total of ¥31,084 million. A summary of each cash flow and major factor are as follows.

(Operating Cash Flow)

Operating cash flow was ¥9,499 million, an increase of ¥2,193 million versus the previous same period.

This was mainly due to increases in income before income taxes.

(Investing Cash Flow)

Net investing activities used ¥3,680million in cash, a decrease of ¥669 million versus the previous same period, primarily due to purchase of property, plant, and equipment.

(Financing Cash Flow)

Net financing activities used \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{3}\),343 million in cash, a decrease of \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{5}\)89 million versus the previous same period mainly due to payment in dividends to shareholders.

Our group will strongly pursue the following initiatives: as the No. 1 company in powder technology, we will continue to provide new technologies and system engineering capabilities tailored to customer needs, enhance our maintenance service and toll processing services, expand our materials business including hair growth and oral care products utilizing our proprietary nanoparticle compounding technology, and strengthen our brand power in the blown film-related business. We will also continuously launch new products and systems with high added value, such as expanding the aftermarket business and providing digital solutions applying IIoT technology, to improve profitability. Although the real economy appears to be relatively firm at the moment, with companies absorbing tariff costs in the United States, downside risks to the economy are assumed to remain. These risks include the impact of U.S. trade policy on the real economy, intervention by the U.S. administration in monetary policy, global inflation due to rising geopolitical tensions, and a sharp rise in long-term interest rates caused by expanding fiscal deficits. As a result, the global economy is expected to remain in an unpredictable situation. Amid this economic environment, factors such as the postponement or cancellation of investment decisions by our customers may affect the future financial condition, operating results, and cash flows of our group. For the preparation of this outlook, the average market exchange rate is assumed to be 140.00 yen to the U.S. dollar and 160.00 yen to the euro.

(Matters related to the assumption of going concern)

There is no applicable information.

(Significant change in the amount of shareholders' equity)

Hosokawa Micron Corporation (hereafter referred to as "the Company") resolved, at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on November 21, 2024 to file a proposal regarding reduction of capital surplus at the Annual General Meeting of Shareholders held on December 17, 2024, and the proposal was approved at its meeting. As the result of the transfer to other capital surplus, the legal capital surplus was reduced by ¥3,000 million on February 28, 2025.

The Company acquired 177,400 shares of its own stocks during the fourth quarter of the consolidated fiscal year based on a resolution of the Board of Directors meetings held on August 8th, 2025. As a result, treasury stocks increased by ¥999 million, and its balance at consolidated fiscal year end amounted to ¥3,773 million.

(Significant change in the scope of consolidation)

There is no applicable information.

In addition, significant change in the scope of consolidation is not applicable as follows.

The Company absorbed Hosokawa Micron Cosmetics Corporation on October 1, 2024, which resulted in exclusion of the scope of consolidation.

(Change in accounting policies)

Application of "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes", etc.

The Company has applied the "Accounting Standard for Current Income Taxes" (ASBJ Statement No. 27, October 28, 2022 and other relevant standards from the beginning of the first quarter of the current fiscal year.

With regard to revisions to categories for recording current income taxes (taxation on other comprehensive income), the Company complies with the transitional treatment stipulated in the proviso of paragraph 20-3 of the Revised Accounting Standard of 2022 and the transitional treatment stipulated in the proviso of paragraph 65-2 (2) of the "Guidance on Accounting Standard for Tax Effect Accounting" (ASBJ Guidance No. 28, October 28, 2022). These changes in the accounting policy do not affect the consolidated financial statements.

1 Overview of reportable segments

Our reportable segments are those for which financial information is available separately and regular evaluation by the Board of Directors is being performed to evaluate distribution of organization's resources and performance.

Our group has its business headquarters at the main office. We formulate comprehensive domestic and international strategies for the products and services we handle and carry out our business activities accordingly.

Therefore, our group is comprised of segments based on products and services, with "Powder Processing Business" and "Blown Film Business" as our two reportable segments.

The "Powder Processing Business" manufactures and sells grinding and classifying equipment, mixing and drying equipment, as well as air pollution control equipment, dust collectors for product collection, and precision air conditioning control equipment for the Japanese market. We also develop new materials, primarily composite nanoparticles, and commercialize them, in addition to providing toll processing services for fine powders. The "Blown Film Business" develops, manufactures, and sells various types of high-performance blown film equipment from single to multiple layers.

2 Calculation method of sales, profits, assets, and other items by reportable segment

The accounting policies applied to the reportable segments are identical to those applied in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements. Segment profit is based on operating profit. Inter-segment sales are recorded at market prices.
