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1. Results of Operations

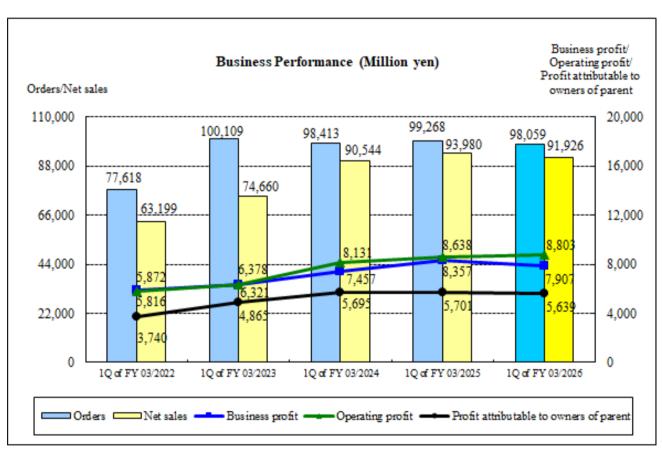
- (1) Results of Operations
 - 1) Three Months Ended June 30, 2025 (April 1, 2025 June 30, 2025)

During the three months ended June 30, 2025, the global economy continued to recover moderately despite increasing uncertainty due to the ongoing deteriorating situations in Ukraine and the Middle East, as well as rises in U.S. tariffs.

In Japan, production activities in the manufacturing industry were slow, but capital expenditures were solid due to high corporate earnings. Overseas, the U.S. economy slowed. European economies continued to recover, partly due to last-minute production increases before the rise in U.S. tariffs. The Chinese economy showed signs of recovery thanks to the effects of measures aimed at boosting domestic demand. Economic sentiment in Asian countries other than China varied widely.

In this environment, total consolidated orders for the Kurita Group (the "Group") in the three months ended June 30, 2025 decreased 1.2% from the level of the year-ago period, to 98,059 million yen, and net sales decreased 2.2%, to 91,926 million yen. Business profit* decreased 5.4%, to 7,907 million yen, operating profit was 8,803 million yen, up 1.9% versus the year-ago period, profit before tax was 8,638 million yen, declined 1.1%, and profit attributable to owners of parent amounted to 5,639 million yen, down 1.1%.

2) Segment Information

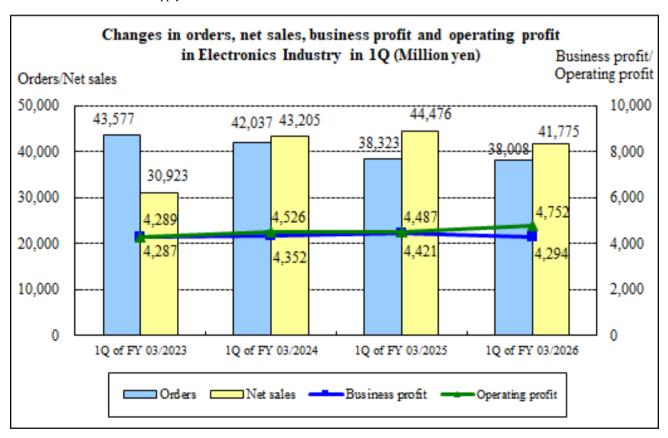
The Group has Electronics Industry and General Industry as two reportable segments in its segment information in order to formulate strategies based on an in-depth examination of the characteristics of each market and to expand solutions by combining diverse products and services, from the viewpoint of providing value to society and customers.

Due to a reorganization that occurred in the fiscal year under review, Arcade Engineering GmbH and certain divisions of Kurita America Inc. (water treatment facilities business), which were previously classified into the General Industry segment, have been moved to the Electronics Industry segment. The figures for the same period of the previous fiscal year have been adjusted to reflect the changes in the reportable segments.

(i) Electronics Industry

Total Group orders for the Electronics Industry segment fell 0.8% from the previous fiscal year, to 38,008 million yen. Orders for water treatment facilities fell due to the lack of an order for a large-scale project in the same period of the previous fiscal year. Orders for maintenance also decreased. The demand for precision tool cleaning declined due to a fall in capacity utilization at plants of certain customers. Orders for recurring contract-based services, including the ultrapure water supply business, rose. Total Group net sales for the Electronics Industry segment amounted to 41,775 million yen, a decrease of 6.1% year on year. Net sales of water treatment facilities declined due to the lack of sales from large-scale projects in China recorded in the same period of the previous fiscal year. Net sales from maintenance services increased due to sales from a backlog of orders. Net sales of recurring contract-based services increased, reflecting ultrapure water supply contracts, which began in the previous fiscal year. Net sales from precision tool cleaning dropped.

In terms of profits, business profit stood at 4,294 million yen, a decrease of 2.9% year on year, chiefly due to a decline in net sales. Operating profit came to 4,752 million yen, an increase of 5.9% year on year, reflecting a one-time profit from the cancellation of water supply service contracts with certain customers.



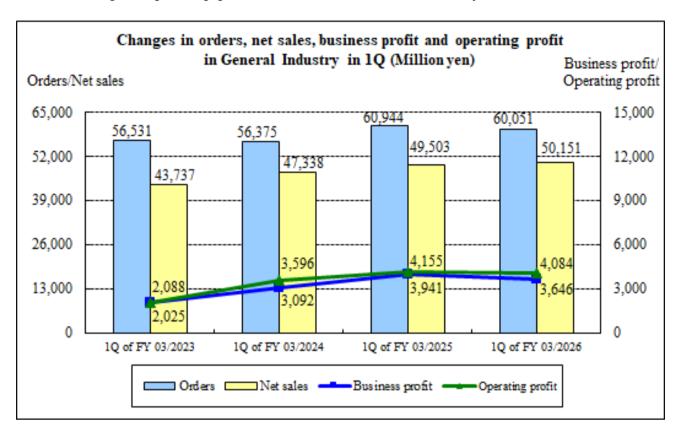
(ii) General Industry

Total Group orders for the General Industry segment fell 1.5% from the previous fiscal year, to 60,051 million yen. Orders for water treatment facilities decreased. Orders for maintenance and recurring contract-based services increased. Orders for soil remediation declined due to the lack of orders for large projects in the previous fiscal year. Orders for water treatment chemicals also decreased due to the stronger yen, which had a negative effect when orders were converted to yen, and a decline in demand in certain markets in Southeast Asia.

Total Group net sales for the General Industry segment amounted to 50,151 million yen, an increase of 1.3% year on year. Net

sales for water treatment facilities and maintenance increased due to a backlog of orders from the previous fiscal year. Net sales for recurring contract-based services also rose. Net sales for water treatment chemicals dropped.

In terms of profits, business profit stood at 3,646 million yen, a decrease of 7.5% year on year, chiefly reflecting additional costs incurred in a certain maintenance project. Operating profit totaled 4,084 million yen, a decline of 1.7% year on year, reflecting the recording of foreign exchange gains from subsidiaries in the United States and Europe.



(2) Financial Condition

Condition of Assets, Liabilities and Equity

- 1) Total assets: 532,866 million yen, a decrease of 16,083 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year
 - Current assets totaled 206,309 million yen at the end of the first quarter, a decrease of 14,641 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This is mainly due to a decrease of 9,345 million yen in cash and cash equivalents and a decline of 6,618 million yen in trade and other receivables.
 - Non-current assets totaled 326,557 million yen at the end of the first quarter, a decrease of 1,441 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease of 1,542 million yen in deferred tax assets.
- 2) Liabilities: 206,959 million yen, a decrease of 3,485 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. Current liabilities totaled 130,324 million yen at the end of the first quarter, a decrease of 2,243 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This is chiefly attributable to a decrease of 4,320 million yen in trade and other payables, a reduction of 3,636 million yen in income taxes payable, and a drop of 4,157 million yen in other current liabilities, which outweighed an increase of 9,041 million yen in bonds and borrowings, which primarily resulted from the issuance of commercial papers.

 Non-current liabilities totaled 76,635 million yen at the end of the period, a decrease of 1,242 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease in bonds and borrowings of 1,075 million yen resulting from the

 The decrease in equity was primarily attributable to a decrease of 12,575 million yen in equity attributable to owners of parent, primarily due to an increase of 12,233 million yen in treasury shares, which occurred due to purchases made in the market.

(3) Cash Flows

Consolidated cash and cash equivalents at the end of the first quarter totaled 53,606 million yen, a decrease of 9,345 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year.

The various cash flows and related factors are outlined below.

1) Cash Flows from Operating Activities

Net cash provided by operating activities during the first quarter ended June 30, 2025 totaled 10,320 million yen, a decrease of 6,386 million yen from the same period of the previous fiscal year. This was chiefly due to inflows, including profit before tax of 8,638 million yen, depreciation expense, amortization and impairment losses of 8,696 million yen, and a decrease in trade and other receivables of 5,518 million yen, which were partially offset by outflows, including a decrease in trade and other payables of 2,562 million yen, income taxes paid of 6,115 million yen, and other (primarily a decrease in provision for bonuses) of 3,096 million yen.

2) Cash Flows from Investing Activities

Net cash used in investing activities totaled 10,115 million yen, a decrease of 5,087 million yen from the same period of the previous fiscal year. Cash was used mainly for purchase of property, plant and equipment of 8,509 million yen and payments into time deposits of 1,769 million yen.

3) Cash Flows from Financing Activities

Net cash used in financing activities totaled 10,710 million yen, an increase of 6,446 million yen from the same period of the previous fiscal year. Cash was used mainly for purchase of treasury shares of 12,237 million yen and dividends paid of 5,209 million yen, which were partially offset by a net increase in short-term borrowings and commercial paper of 9,097 million yen due to financing through the issuance of commercial papers.

The Group's basic policy is to constantly secure the liquidity necessary for business operations and establish a stable fundraising system. Short-term working capital, capital investment and other investments in growth fields depend chiefly on the Group's own funds, but the Group procures financing through bond markets and bank loans as needed. As of the end of the period under review, the Group has concluded commitment line contracts with two financial institutions (no borrowing executed and unexecuted borrowings within the commitment line was 20,000 million yen).

(4) Forecasts for the Fiscal Year Ending March 31, 2026

The Group considers that consolidated earnings forecasts for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026 will be consistent with the forecast for the first half of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026 and for the full fiscal year stated in the "Consolidated Financial Results for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2025" released on May 8, 2025.

The business forecasts are made by the Company based on information available at the time of publication of this report and may differ from actual results due to changes in a range of factors.

To reflect this change in presentation, the Company has reclassified its condensed quarterly consolidated statement of cash flows for the first quarter of the previous fiscal year.

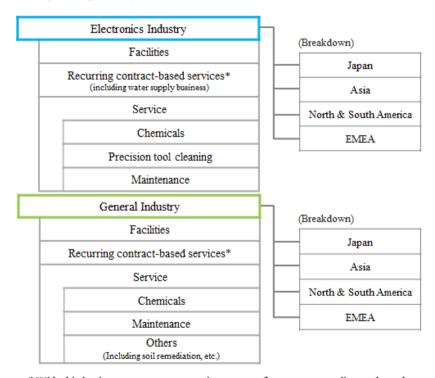
Consequently, the -0 million yen recorded in the "Other" item of cash flows from financing activities in the condensed quarterly consolidated statement of cash flows for the first quarter of the previous fiscal year is now presented as -0 million yen in purchase of treasury shares.

(Segment Information)

(1) Overview of reportable segments

The Company's reportable segments are components of the Group about which separate financial information is available. These segments are subject to periodic review to enable the Company's board of directors to decide how to allocate resources and assess performance.

The Group has Electronics Industry and General Industry as two reportable segments in order to formulate strategies based on an in-depth examination of the characteristics of each market and to expand solutions by combining diverse products and services, from the viewpoint of providing value to society and customers.



^{*} With this business structure, a certain amount of revenue according to the value of services provided is consistently secured.

(Changes in Reportable Segments)

Following a reorganization that occurred in the fiscal year under review, Arcade Engineering GmbH and certain divisions of Kurita America Inc. (water treatment facilities business), which were previously classified into the General Industry segment, have been moved to the Electronics Industry segment. The control is not temporary. The Group continues to perform accounting treatment for all business combination transactions under common control based on book value.
