The Okada Museum of Art has been exhibiting artworks borrowed under an agreement with Okada Fine Art Limited. Recently, Okada Fine Art Limited has requested the return of certain artworks. Accordingly, the museum will be temporarily closed to carry out the return process.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and sincerely ask for your understanding.

The Okada Museum of Art opened in autumn 2013 in Kowakudani, Hakone. The museum spans five floors and exhibits a wide range of artworks, including Japanese and other East Asian ceramics and paintings. The museum also has unique ancillary facilities such as the Foot Bath Café, featuring 100% natural, free-flowing hot spring, overlooking a massive mural depicting Fujin and Raijin (Wind God and Thunder God) painted by contemporary Japanese painter Kotaro Fukui, and Kaikatei Restaurant, where visitors can enjoy seasonal views of the gardens while dining.
