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Notice on Revision of Consolidated Financial Results Forecasts

MIMAKI ENGINEERING CO., LTD. (the "Company") announces that, in view of recent business performance trends, the following revision has been made to the consolidated financial results forecast published on May 13, 2025.

1. Revision of results forecast

(2) Reason for revision

The Company expects the intensified competition in the direct to film (DTF) model to have an impact, as will the postponement of the new product launch scheduled in the second half to the next fiscal year due to the time required for verifying certain product development. Consequently, the Company has reviewed sales by product market and area based on the outlook for new product development. As a result, net sales and profits are expected to fall short of the initial plan, and the Company has revised downward its forecasts for net sales and profits.

In the second half of the fiscal year, the Company expects the market environment to remain firm with no major changes in demand for industrial inkjet printers on a global basis. To this end, the Company will promote sales of new products that have already been launched and shift sales strategies for existing products. In addition, the Company will maintain its investment in development for future growth, while striving to improve profitability by allocating other expenses in line with net sales.

The main exchange rates for the third quarter and beyond, which are the assumptions for the consolidated earnings forecast, will be revised to US\$1: 144 yen and 1 euro: 152 yen.

(For reference: exchange rates assumed at the time of the forecast at the beginning of the fiscal year: US\$1: 135 yen, 1 euro: 152 yen)
