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1. Overview of business performance, etc.

(1) Overview of business results for this quarter

During the interim consolidated accounting period under review, the Japanese economy showed a moderate recovery trend given the improved employment and income environment although prices continued to rise. On the other hand, the economic outlook remains uncertain due to concerns about an economic recession caused by the U.S. tariff policy, sluggish demand mainly in the manufacturing industry in Europe, and the stagnant real estate market in China.

The Group is working to transform into a brand new IDEC as it focuses on shifting toward a more customer-centric business structure and improving the ability to respond to changes in the market across the globe under its medium-term plan that started this fiscal year and is working as one to implement structural reforms that will realize sustainable growth.

Under these circumstances, the Group saw domestic net sales increase by 333 million yen year on year to total 11,471 million yen (up 3.0% year on year), due in part to the optimization of distributors' inventories, despite some impact on sales from the uncertain market outlook arising from the U.S. tariff policy. Although overseas net sales declined due to weakened demand in the European market caused by economic stagnation and geopolitical risks, sales increased in the Asia-Pacific region, particularly in China, thanks to growing demand in the automobile and semiconductor industries and the ongoing normalization of distributors' inventories, resulting in a year on year increase of 688 million yen to 22,639 million yen (up 3.1% year on year). As a result, consolidated net sales for the interim consolidated accounting period under review totaled 34,111 million yen (up 3.1% year on year).

In terms of profit, operating profit increased 1,060 million yen year on year to total 2,611 million yen (up 68.4% year on year) due not only to the positive impact of increased sales, but also to a decrease in selling, general and administrative expenses resulting from the promotion of structural reforms. Ordinary profit increased 1,446 million yen to reach 2,909 million yen (up 98.8% year on year) due to the recording of foreign exchange gains, and profit attributable to owners of the parent increased 473 million yen to total 1,755 million yen (up 37.0% year on year).

Results by segment for the interim consolidated accounting period under review are as follows.

[Japan]

In Japan, net sales increased 37 million yen year on year to total 12,520 million yen (up 0.3% year on year), and operating profit increased 801 million yen year on year to total 826 million yen (operating profit of 25 million yen for the same period of the previous fiscal year) due to the normalization of distribution inventories and the effects of structural reforms, despite some impact on sales from the uncertain market outlook arising from the U.S. tariff policy and the influence of business transfers within group companies.

[Americas]

In North America, shipments in first quarter were affected by delays in launching a new U.S. logistics center but recovered in second quarter. Net sales rose 177 million yen year on year to hit 7,192 million yen (up 2.5% year on year), partly due to passing on additional U.S. tariffs to prices. However, selling expenses increased from company integration and new site setup, decreased operating profit 275 million yen year on year to total 445 million yen (down 38.2% year on year).

[Europe, Middle East and Africa(EMEA)]

In the European market, net sales decreased 614 million yen year on year to hit 7,206 million yen (down 7.9% year on year), and operating loss totaled 406 million yen (operating loss of 146 million yen for the same period of the previous fiscal year). This was due to weak demand from major industries caused by the economic downturn and geopolitical risks.

[Asia Pacific]

In the Asia-Pacific region, net sales increased 1,421 million yen year on year to total 7,191 million yen (up 24.6% year on year), and operating profit rose 1,051 million yen year on year to hit 1,581 million yen (up 198.6% year on year) as distributors' inventories were optimized while demand from the automobile and semiconductor industries in China grew.

Net sales by product category for the interim consolidated accounting period under review are as follows. The "Other" product category has been eliminated since this interim consolidated accounting period due to the sale of IDEC SYSTEMS & CONTROLS CORPORATION in the previous consolidated fiscal year.

[HMI]

Net sales decreased 300 million yen year on year to total 16,077 million yen (down 1.8% year on year) due to the economic slowdown and declining demand in the special-purpose vehicle industry in Europe, although distributors' inventories of industrial switches and programmable displays for factory automation have been largely normalized.

*This product category includes control switches, joysticks, indicator lights, and programmable displays, which are key human-machine interfaces (HMIs).

[Industrial relays & components]

Net sales were up 794 million yen year on year to hit 6,281 million yen (up 14.5% year on year) due to strong sales of industrial relays in the Asia-Pacific region, our key market, as well as in the North American market.

*This product category includes switching power supplies, terminal blocks, control relays/sockets, and circuit protectors, which are built into control panels for controlling and operating machines and production lines and are used as the basis for control parts of machines and equipment.

[Automation & sensing]

Net sales decreased 731 million yen year on year to total 3,442 million yen (down 17.5% year on year) due to a decrease in new orders for our mainstay programmable logic controllers due to inventory adjustments at OEMs.

*This product category includes products designed to contribute to the automation of equipment used in a wide range of industrial and consumer applications, programmable controllers, which act as the brains of machines and equipment, and automatic identification devices, which are used in retail, logistics,

and various other areas.

[Safety & explosion protection]

Net sales increased 841 million yen year on year to reach 6,047 million yen (up 16.2% year on year) due to steady sales of safety-related products in our key markets of Japan and the Asia-Pacific region, especially in China.

*This product category includes safety components, such as emergency stop pushbutton switches, safety switches, and enabling devices, which protect the safety of industrial sites, as well as explosion-protection devices that prevent accidents at sites where explosive gases exist, such as oil and chemical plants.

[Systems]

Net sales increased 727 million yen year on year to reach 2,261 million yen (up 47.4% year on year) due to an increase in sales of control panels for semiconductor manufacturing facilities, logistics facilities, etc. in the Asia-Pacific region.

*This product category includes various systems custom-made with IDEC products according to customer needs as well as collaborative robot system solutions that combine safety components and safety technologies to create optimal systems.

(2) Overview of financial position for this quarter

(Assets, liabilities, and net assets)

Total assets at the end of the interim consolidated accounting period under review came to 106,316 million yen, a decrease of 900 million yen since the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease of 4,904 million yen in cash and deposit, despite an increase of 2,056 million yen in inventories and 1,740 million yen in property, plant and equipment and intangible assets.

Liabilities decreased 3,226 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year to total 40,180 million yen. This fall was mainly due to a decrease of 2,651 million yen in borrowings and 452 million yen in accrued expenses.

Net assets increased 2,325 million yen from the end of the previous fiscal year to reach 66,135 million yen mainly due to an increase of 2,428 million yen in foreign currency translation adjustments.

(Cash flows)

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the interim consolidated accounting period under review came to 14,274 million yen, a decrease of 4,920 million yen since the end of the previous fiscal year.

Cash flows and main reasons for the results for the interim consolidated accounting period under review are as follows.

Net cash provided by operating activities was 2,288 million yen compared with 6,741 million yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase of 1,331 million yen in inventories and payment of 1,165 million yen in income taxes, while the recording of 2,759 million yen of profit before income taxes and 1,985 million yen of depreciation.

Net cash used in investing activities was 1,959 million yen, compared with 1,082 million yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to the disbursement of 1,969 million yen for acquisition of property, plant and equipment.

Net cash used in financing activities was 4,802 million yen, compared with 4,250 million yen in the same period of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to the disbursement of 2,646 million yen through the repayment of loans and 1,912 million yen through the payment of dividends.

(3) Explanation of future forecast information such as consolidated financial results forecasts There is no change to the consolidated earnings forecast for the fiscal year ending March 2026, which was announced in the "Consolidated Financial Results for the Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 2025" dated May 15, 2025.

During the interim consolidated accounting period, APEM, Inc., which was a consolidated subsidiary of the Company, was dissolved due to an absorption merger with IDEC CORPORATION, a consolidated subsidiary of the Company, as the surviving company, and therefore has been excluded from the scope of consolidation.

[Notes - When there are significant changes in amounts of equity]

At the board of directors meeting held on May 15, 2025, the Company resolved to cancel treasury shares pursuant to the provisions of Article 178 of the Companies Act, and on May 23, 2025, executed the cancellation of 1,850,000 treasury shares.

As a result, during the interim consolidated accounting period of the cumulative consolidated accounting period, capital surplus and treasury stock each decreased by 3,404 million yen.
