SBTi Validation of Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Targets

KOA CORPORATION (the Company) is pleased to announce that the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction targets set by our company have been validated by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi), an international climate change initiative, as science-based targets, as outlined below. DRIVING AMBITIOUS CORPORATE CLIMATE ACTION

The SBTi is a global initiative that assesses and validates whether corporate GHG emissions reduction targets are aligned with the latest climate science. It promotes corporate decarbonization efforts in support of the Paris Agreement goal of limiting the increase in global average temperature to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels.

In accordance with the SBTi criteria, KOA has established the following GHG emissions reduction targets aligned with the 1.5°C pathway:

Scope1: Direct GHG emissions from sources owned or controlled by the company

Scope2: Indirect GHG emissions from the consumption of purchased electricity, heat, and other energy

Scope3: All other indirect GHG emissions occurring throughout the value chain, excluding Scope1 and Scope2
