The group operates principally in the financial securities business, and its operating results are likely to be affected by market fluctuations. Due to such nature of its business and difficulty in predicting its performance, group does not forecast business results and dividends. At the end of the term, we make efforts to release the preliminary numbers, as we will finalize the financial results.

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1. Qualitative information for the Six months ended September 30, 2025

(1) Explanation of consolidated management results

For the period under review (April 1, 2025 to September 30, 2025), global equity markets initially declined sharply due to heightened concerns surrounding the reciprocal tariff measures announced by the U.S. Trump administration in April. However, market sentiment subsequently turned to risk-on, supported by factors such as tariff agreements between the U.S. and other countries, the enactment of spending and tax reduction bills, the resumption of rate cuts by FRB, and monetary and fiscal easing measures in Europe and China.

In the U.S. equity market, investor interest strengthened in semiconductor, cloud, and power-related stocks associated with generative AI. From July through September, major stock indices such as the Dow Jones Industrial Average, S&P 500, and the Nasdaq Composite continued to hit record highs. Despite, U.S. economy has shown signs of a slowdown in the labor market and there are concerns about the impact of reciprocal tariffs on domestic prices, optimism surrounding the expansion of emerging industries and prospects for additional rate cuts continued to support stock prices.

In Japan's equity market, the Nikkei 225 plunged sharply in April following the U.S. initiated reciprocal tariff shock. However, stock prices subsequently rebounded, supported by positive factors such as the tariff agreement with the U.S., expectations for an exit from deflation, and a global surge in investments related to generative AI, pushing the index to a record closing high of 45,754 yen on September 25. While the Japanese economy is expected to face headwinds in exports and manufacturing due to the implementation of U.S. reciprocal tariffs, signs of a positive economic cycle are emerging, supported by wage increases, potential additional rate hikes by the Bank of Japan, and the growth of generative AI-related companies.

In Asian stock markets, notable gains were seen in China (including Hong Kong), where economic support measures have been intensified; in South Korea and Taiwan, it was driven by their high weighting of semiconductor-related companies; and in Vietnam, it was supported by strong exports and active infrastructure investment. Among these, the KOSPI, the Taiwan Weighted Index, and Vietnam's VN Index all hit record highs between July and September, while the Shanghai Composite Index also rebounded to its highest level in about a decade. Although economic trends across Asian countries remain mixed, optimism toward the growth of emerging industries and continued policy support has provided strong momentum for stock prices.

Under these circumstances, our group renewed its corporate philosophy in April 2025. Under this, our Purpose (meaning of our existence) is "More Prosperity to More People" and our Vision (our ideal state) is "Your Long-Term Partner in Building Generational Wealth", and our Values (our key values) consist of the following four pillars, "Challenge, Relationship, Professionalism, and Teamwork". We have also formulated the "AIZAWA Declarations" — a clear and enduring commitment to all our stakeholders, including our clients, shareholders, society, and employees.

Based on the new corporate philosophy, we have formulated a three-year medium-term management plan covering the fiscal years ending March 2026 through March 2028, titled "Your Long-Term Partner in Building Generational Wealth". This medium-term management plan outlines business strategies focused on transforming financial securities business, upgrading investment business, and restructuring asset management business. We will strive to establish a business model that partners with our clients and their families in building their generational wealth, and to transform the business structure and earnings structure for ensuring that we are able to consistently achieve a stable ROE of 8% or more.

The group company, along with its core financial securities business, operates investment business and asset management business. Progress and initiatives of each business segment are as below:

[Financial securities business]

AIZAWA SECURITIES CO., LTD., which manages the financial securities business, is advancing reforms to stabilize its revenue structure. The company is transitioning from its traditional market-based sales approach (MBA)—A sales style, where financial institutions propose financial products (such as individual stocks and mutual funds) that they believe have the potential for price increase or yield to a goal-based sales approach (GBA). The GBA sales approach pursued by the company involves closely aligning with our customers' life plans to provide plans designed to help achieve their individual financial goals. Offer long-term support for asset management and asset building through a comprehensive support system that goes far

beyond individual transactions.

Through the GBA sales approach, company is focusing on expanding the balance of products generating recurring income, such as mutual funds and wrap accounts, to build a stable earnings structure less affected by market fluctuations. As of at the end of September 2025, total AUC was 2.3087 trillion yen, including AUC generating recurring income of 516.5 billion yen.

As part of our platform business, the company is collaborating with regional financial institutions, insurance agencies, and IFA's such as corporates having a client base requiring long-term financial guidance. We provide personalized, face-to-face advisories to those clients. Our efforts focus on acquiring installment investment accounts for clients in the asset formation segment and increasing their monthly contribution amounts, thereby working to expand our customer base. At the end of September 2025, within the platform business, total AUC was 337.2 billion yen, with AUC generating recurring income accounting for 118.9 billion yen.

With the expansion of our platform business, trading-related expenses including intermediary commissions paid to IFA's (recorded under selling, general and administrative expenses) have increased. However, as this remains a key channel for approaching customers in the asset-building segment, we will continue to focus on strengthening the platform business.

[Investment business]

AIZAWA Investments Co., Ltd., which conducts proprietary investments, focuses on medium- to long-term investments in public listed securities, targeting local and global growth companies as well as companies with stable expected returns, including dividends. Additionally, it invests in promising ventures companies and supports their future path towards public listing. It also makes investments in venture capital funds, private equity funds, and private debt funds. It also makes direct investments in domestic real estate, primarily by holding residential properties in the Tokyo metropolitan area to generate rental income.

Within our group, the investment business is regarded as a core pillar for enhancing asset efficiency and stabilizing consolidated earnings. Our primary focus is on maximizing medium-term investment returns through portfolio management, risk controls, and performance evaluation.

[Asset management business]

AIZAWA ASSET MANAGEMENT Co., Ltd., operating in the asset management business, strives to be "the most desired alternative asset management company in Japan." It focuses on managing alternative assets, particularly in the areas of private equity. Its aim to become a leading company in the field of "secondary investment in private equity" in Japan and is also actively working to increase awareness of same both domestically and globally. Considering that private assets have the potential to generate higher returns than public listed market investments and offer return prospects aligned with their risk profile, we are placing strategic emphasis on increasing our assets under management in this segment.

As part of our efforts to enhance shareholder returns, we plan to return a total of more than 20 billion yen to shareholders between the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025 and the fiscal year ending March 31, 2028. (Approximately 10 billion yen as special dividends and approximately 10 billion yen as ordinary dividends and share buybacks).

Additionally, the Company plans to issue bonds totaling up to 30 billion yen over a two-year period, from October 28, 2024 (effective date) to October 27, 2026, following the filing of a shelf registration for the bonds in October 2024. The purpose of this bond issuance is to enhance financial stability by diversifying funding methods and to establish a framework that enables the flexible procurement of funds necessary for the future growth of the group.

The group will continue to strive for sustainable growth and mid-to long-term enhancement of corporate value by leveraging the strengths of each subsidiary.

For the six months ended September 30, 2025, break-down of business results are as follow; (Percentage indicates a year-on-year change. The same shall apply hereinafter in this section)

(Commission received)

Total commissions received increased by 10.0% to 7,629 million yen, due to an increase in the trading turnover of equities.

(Net trading income)

Net trading income declined by 13.9% to 1,461 million yen, due to the decline in trading turnover of OTC foreign equities.

(Net financial income)

Net financial income declined by 4.5% to 391 million yen. Under this category, income increased by 0.1% to 453 million yen and expenses increased by 44.6% to 61 million yen.

(Other operating revenue and expenses)

Other operating revenues declined by 12.1% to 393 million yen, led by the decline in the sales of operational investment securities. Other operating expenses increased by 62.5% to 429 million yen, due to the increase in the cost of operational investment securities.

(Selling, general and administrative expenses)

Selling, general and administrative expenses increased by 8.4% to 9,673 million yen due to an increase in trading related expenses including intermediary commissions paid to IFA's, in line with expansion of platform business.

(Non-operating profit and losses)

Non-operating profit declined by 4.9% to 335 million yen. Under this category, income was 456 million yen including the dividend income of 273 million yen and profit distributions of 122 million yen. While expenses under this category totaled 120 million yen, including 55 million yen in interest expenses and 49 million yen in interest on short-term bonds.

(Extraordinary profit and losses)

Total extraordinary profit was 1,452 million yen. Under this category, extraordinary income was 1,460 million yen due to gain on sales of investment securities, extraordinary losses were 7 million yen including the loss of 4 million yen on disposal of non-current assets.

With the above factors, for the reporting period, operating revenue was 9,937 million yen (+4.2%); operating loss was 226 million yen due to higher selling, general, and administrative expenses, including trading related expenses; ordinary profit was 108 million yen (-83.5%) and profit attributable to owners of parent was 10 billion yen (-34.4%). (All percentage comparisons indicate year-on-year changes).

(Assets)

As of the end of the period under review, total assets were 133,619 million yen, an increase of 24,090 million yen. This was mainly due to an increase of 13,877 million yen in cash and deposits; an increase of 8,787 million yen in cash segregated as deposits; and an increase of 3,867 million yen in investment securities.

(Liabilities)

As of the end of the period under review, total liabilities were 85,857 million yen, an increase of 23,928 million yen. This was mainly due to an increase of 19,112 million yen and 5,000 million yen in deposits received and short-term bonds respectively.

(Net assets)

As for the period under review, total net assets were 47,761 million yen, an increase of 162 million yen. This was mainly due to increase of 1,155 million yen in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities; and a decline of 530 million yen and 328 million yen in retained earnings and foreign currency translation reserve respectively.
