Account items and other matters stated in the quarterly consolidated financial statements of the Company were previously presented in units of thousands of yen. Starting from the first quarter under review and the first three-month period under review, they are presented in units of millions of yen. For ease of comparison, figures for the previous fiscal year and the first three-month period in the previous fiscal year have also been restated in units of millions of yen.

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1. Overview of Operating Results, etc.

(1) Overview of Operating Results for the Period Under Review

During the three months ended August 31, 2025 (the "three-month period under review"), in the Japanese economy, although there were signs of year-on-year real wage growth turning positive amid continued wage hikes and improvements in employment conditions, the expansion of personal consumption remained somewhat subdued with the persistently strong tendency to save money due to continued increases in the prices of imported products, which resulted from elevated food prices and tariff policies.

In addition, as the Trump administration in the U.S. has implemented full-fledged high tariff policies, uncertainties over the global trade environment have heightened. While some level of agreements have been reached with major countries including Japan through tariff negotiations, there are concerns over the impact on export companies, as high tariffs remain imposed. Furthermore, with ongoing geopolitical risks such as intensified tensions in the Middle East and the U.S.-China trade friction, the outlook for the world economy remains uncertain.

The contact center and business process outsourcing (BPO) industry to which the Group belongs continues to experience a certain degree of demand against a backdrop of response to wage hikes and a structural labor shortage. In addition, the shift to sophisticated services has been accelerated with the progress of the cloud migration of contact center systems, as well as the advancement of support for operators with the use of generative artificial intelligence.

Under such business conditions, in its Medium-Term Management Plan 2025, which covers the period until the fiscal year ending May 31, 2026, the Group has established a vision of "a company that continues to grow healthily from roots to buds" and declared its aim of achieving growth from both its existing business (the roots) of "contact centers and BPO services" and its new businesses (the buds) of "development and sale of the Cloud PBX*, Omnia LINK, and other systems."

(Contact centers and BPO services)

Regarding contact centers and BPO services, although once robust demand for contracts related to the new NISA in the financial industry has been declining, the financial, IT and distribution industries, which are our focus areas, continues to enjoy steady growth. This is thanks to the acquisition of new projects and the expansion of existing operations by leveraging synergies with the financial, IT and distribution industries, such as support operations related to settlement terminals and credit cards. However, net sales decreased year-on-year as this growth failed to offset the reduced volume of business in a specific public project which had continued from the previous fiscal year.

Regarding operating expenses, we have promoted the optimization of costs aligned with the level of net sales—we have implemented initiatives to curb the indirect labor cost rate in accordance with the short-term plan disclosed on May 29, 2025, and have worked on restructuring to optimize the total number of seats at each location based on the plan. While these measures are intended to improve a profit margin from the second half of the fiscal year ending May, 31, 2026, in the three-month period under review, operating profit decreased year on year due to a decrease in net sales and the impact of expenses for optimizing our cost structure. As of August 31, 2025, the number of operation booths totaled 7,042 in 17 locations nationwide.

(Development and sale of the Cloud PBX, Omnia LINK, and other systems)

Regarding the sale of the Cloud PBX, Omnia LINK to outside customers, the number of licenses as of August 31, 2025 totaled 4,788, up 38.9% year-on-year, and the annual recurring revenue (ARR: calculated by multiplying monthly recurring revenue by 12 months) reached \(\frac{1}{4}\),160 million, up 34.1% year-on-year, showing the drastic increases and maintaining steady growth. The increases were mainly due to the commencement of

delivering licenses related to new projects acquired in the previous fiscal year. The number of proposals for large projects with the scale of using over 100 licenses per company also increased by strengthening our structures for sales.

With the aim of steadily increasing the number of licenses, we will continue to strengthen our structures for sales and service provision, thereby leading to the acquisition of large projects.

As a result of the above, net sales were ¥8,930 million (down 1.8% year-on-year), operating profit was ¥134 million (down 64.9% year-on-year), ordinary profit was ¥135 million (down 64.5% year-on-year), and profit attributable to owners of parent was ¥97 million (down 62.2% year-on-year).

Segment information is omitted as the contact center and BPO business is the Group's sole segment.

(2) Overview of Financial Position for the Period Under Review

(Assets)

Total assets as of August 31, 2025 amounted to \(\xi\$12,980 million, a decrease of \(\xi\$1,514 million compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a \(\xi\$1,532 million decrease in cash and deposits and a \(\xi\$33 million decrease in accounts receivable - trade.

(Liabilities)

Total liabilities as of August 31, 2025 amounted to \(\frac{45}{0.025}\) million, a decrease of \(\frac{45}{516}\) million compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a \(\frac{41}{138}\) million decrease in income taxes payable, a \(\frac{4150}{150}\) million decrease in provision for bonuses, and a \(\frac{4156}{156}\) million decrease in provision for shareholder benefit program.

(Net assets)

Total net assets as of August 31, 2025 amounted to \$7,954 million, a decrease of \$998 million compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease in retained earnings resulting from the payment of \$1,087 million in dividends of surplus, despite the recording of \$97 million in profit attributable to owners of parent.

(3) Explanation of Consolidated Financial Results Forecast and Other Forward-looking Information

There is no change to the consolidated financial results forecast for the fiscal year ending May 31, 2026, which was announced on July 11, 2025.
